The Imprecatory Psalms

- 5, 7, 35, 58, 59, 69, 70, 79, 83, 109, 129, 137, 139, 140, 144
- 1. They are called "Imprecatory" because they are a call for God's wrath and judgment to fall on the enemy, the wicked and evil.

Ps 137:8-9

- 8 O daughter of Babylon, you devastated one,
- How blessed will be the one who repays you
- With the recompense with which you have repaid us.
- 9 How blessed will be the one who seizes and dashes your little ones Against the rock.

Ps 10:15

15 Break the arm of the wicked and the evildoer,

Ps 58:6-8

- 6 O God, shatter their teeth in their mouth;
- Break out the fangs of the young lions, O Lord.
- 7 Let them flow away like water that runs off;
- When he aims his arrows, let them be as headless shafts.
- 8 Let them be as a snail which melts away as it goes along,
- Like the miscarriages of a woman which never see the sun.

- *When David speaks of "hatred" for those who oppose God's kingdom he is neither malicious nor bitter nor vindictive, nor moved by self-centered resentment. But he most certainly is jealous for God's name and firmly against those who blaspheme.

New Testament

Matt 11:23-24

- 23 "And you, Capernaum, will not be exalted to heaven, will you? You will descend to Hades; for if the miracles had occurred in Sodom which occurred in you, it would have remained to this day.
- 24 "Nevertheless I say to you that it will be more tolerable for the land of Sodom in the day of judgment, than for you."

- 9 These will pay the penalty of eternal destruction, away from the presence of the Lord and from the glory of His power,
- 10 when He comes to be glorified in His saints on that day, and to be marveled at among all who have believed for our testimony to you was believed.

Acts 13:8-11

- 8 But Elymas the magician (for so his name is translated) was opposing them, seeking to turn the proconsul away from the faith.
- 9 But Saul, who was also known as Paul, filled with the Holy Spirit, fixed his gaze on him,
- 10 and said, "You who are full of all deceit and fraud, you son of the devil, you enemy of all righteousness, will you not cease to make crooked the straight ways of the Lord?
- 11 "Now, behold, the hand of the Lord is upon you, and you will be blind and not see the sun for a time." And immediately a mist and a darkness fell upon him, and he went about seeking those who would lead him by the hand.

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Rom 12:14-20

- 14 Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse.
- 15 Rejoice with those who rejoice, and weep with those who weep.
- 16 Be of the same mind toward one another; do not be haughty in mind, but associate with the lowly. Do not be wise in your own estimation.
- 17 Never pay back evil for evil to anyone. Respect what is right in the sight of all men.
- 18 If possible, so far as it depends on you, be at peace with all men.
- 19 Never take your own revenge, beloved, but leave room for the wrath of God, for it is written, "VENGEANCE IS MINE, I WILL REPAY," says the Lord.
- 20 "BUT IF YOUR ENEMY IS HUNGRY, FEED HIM, AND IF HE IS THIRSTY, GIVE HIM A DRINK; FOR IN SO DOING YOU WILL HEAP BURNING COALS ON HIS HEAD.

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- 1. They are called "Imprecatory" because they are a call for God's wrath and judgment to fall on the enemy, the wicked and evil.
- 2. The Imprecatory Psalms are *not expressions of personal* vengeance.
- 3. The prayers of imprecation are rarely, if ever, for the destruction of a specific individual but almost always of a class or group, namely, "the wicked" or "those who oppose God". David never asks that he be allowed to "get even" with or "pay back" his enemies. His prayer is that *God* would act justly in dealing with those that oppose him. *There is a vast difference between vindication and vindictiveness*. David's passion was for *the triumph of divine justice, not the satisfaction of personal malice*.

- 4. Imprecatory Psalms are expressions provoked by the horror of sin. If David, Asaph, and others are not bothered by offering prayers of imprecation and we are, is it because they were bothered by sin and we aren't?
- 5. We also must remember that imprecations are nothing more than *human prayers based on divine promises*. One is simply asking God to do what he has already said he will do. "I never knew you; depart from me, you workers of lawlessness." Is it wrong for us to pray that Jesus do precisely that? Is it wrong for us to build a prayer on a promise?
- 6. The people at which the Imprecatory Psalms are directed are not people of a momentary resistance to God but of unrepentant, incessant, hardened and haughty defiance of him. But if they callously and consistently refuse, our only recourse is to pray that God's judgment be full and fair.
- 7. When we say with John, "Come quickly, Lord Jesus," we invite and welcome His return. That prayer is recorded at the end of the book of Revelation after Christ has shown His church the horror and finality of the judgment to come. In that prayer is embedded every imprecatory prayer of the Bible that seeks His judgment, the vindication of His justice, the eradication of the kingdom of this age, and consummation of His kingdom in righteousness, joy, and peace.

- 8. We come before a God who is loving and merciful, but also holy and just, who will by no means leave the guilty unpunished, and whom we approach only through Jesus Christ. These Imprecatory Psalms remind us of the character of our God as judge and of the awful fate that awaits those who reject Him.
- 9. The motivation behind such prayers is zeal for *God's* righteousness, God's honor, God's reputation, and the triumph of *God's* kingdom. Is our willingness to ignore blasphemy and overlook evil due to a deficiency in our love for God and his name? Could our reaction to the imprecatory psalms be traced to the fact that we love men and their favor more than we love God and his?

THE CALL TO GOD

Rev 12:7-9,13

- 7 And there was war in heaven, Michael and his angels waging war with the dragon. The dragon and his angels waged war,
- 8 and they were not strong enough, and there was no longer a place found for them in heaven.
- 9 And the great dragon was thrown down, the serpent of old who is called the devil and Satan, who deceives the whole world; he was thrown down to the earth, and his angels were thrown down with him.
 - 13 And when the dragon saw that he was thrown down to the earth, he persecuted the woman who gave birth to the male child.



War Armageddon

Rev 16:13-16

- 13 And I saw coming out of the mouth of the dragon and out of the mouth of the beast and out of the mouth of the false prophet, three unclean spirits like frogs;
- 14 for they are spirits of demons, performing signs, which go out to the kings of the whole world, to gather them together for the war of the great day of God, the Almighty.
- 15("Behold, I am coming like a thief. Blessed is the one who stays awake and keeps his clothes, so that he will not walk about naked and men will not see his shame.")
- 16 And they gathered them together to the place which in Hebrew is called Har-Magedon.

THE PETITION FOR GOD TO ACT

- 9 Deal with them as with Midian, As with Sisera and Jabin at the torrent of Kishon,

 - "Chase our enemies away from us as quickly as a forest fire burns through a forest and up a mountain."
 - 3 things affect the spread of a fire:
 - 1. Fuel
 - 2. Weather
 - 3. Slope of the land



- 16 Fill their faces with dishonor, That they may seek Your name, O Lord.
 - "God, we pray that you would humble them so that they would repent and be saved."
- 17 Let them be ashamed and dismayed forever, And let them be humiliated and perish,
 - "If they will not be ashamed and repent, let them be put to shame and perish".
- 18 That they may know that You alone, whose name is the Lord, Are the Most High over all the earth.

Phil 2:9-11

- 9 For this reason also, God highly exalted Him, and bestowed on Him the name which is above every name,
- 10 so that at the name of Jesus EVERY KNEE WILL BOW, of those who are in heaven and on earth and under the earth,

Application

- 1. The Christian life is one of balance.
- 2. The Bible tells us that there are things that God loves but there are also things that God hates.
- 3. The Imprecatory Psalms teach us that God is honored and glorified when we express our hatred for the wickedness and evil in the world.
- 4. We are always chased back to the question, "Why does God allow evil and wickedness to exist when He has the power to stop it?"
