"Are You Living a Changed Life?

Titus 2:11-15

December 6, 2015

- 11 For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation to all men,
- 12 instructing us to deny ungodliness and worldly desires and to live sensibly, righteously and godly in the present age,
- 13 looking for the blessed hope and the appearing of the glory of our great God and Savior, Christ Jesus,
- 14 who gave Himself for us to redeem us from every lawless deed, and to purify for Himself a people for His own possession, zealous for good deeds.
- 15 These things speak and exhort and reprove with all authority. Let no one disregard you.

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John 1:14,17

- 14 And the Word became flesh, and dwelt among us, and we saw His glory, glory as of the only begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth.
- 17 For the Law was given through Moses; grace and truth were realized through Jesus Christ.

Grace

- 1. *Grace* is God acting freely, according to His own nature of love, with no promises or obligations to fulfill.
- 2. *Grace*, therefore, is uncaused in those who receive it; its cause lies wholly in the giver God.
- 3. Grace has no debts to pay or fulfilled conditions on man's part to wait for, it can act toward whom and how it pleases. It can and does often place the worst deservers in the highest favors.
- 4. Grace cannot act where there is ability; Grace does not help it is absolute, IT DOES ALL!!
- 5. There is no cause in the person why *Grace* should be shown the person must be brought from trying to give cause to God for His *Grace*.
- 6. The discovery by a person that He is truly the object of *Grace* should produce utmost humility.
- 7. Therefore the flesh has no place in the plan of *Grace*. This is why *Grace* is hated and rejected by the proud natural mind of man.

- 8. Grace in simple terms is God's unmerited favor and supernatural enablement and empowerment for salvation and for daily sanctification.
- 9. *Grace* is everything for nothing to those who don't deserve anything.
- 10. *Grace* is what every man needs, what none can earn and what God alone can and does freely give.
- The grace of God, in Scripture, is described as...
- Glorious (Eph 1:6)
- Abundant (Acts 4:33)
- **Rich** (Eph 1:7)
- Manifold (many-sided) (1Pe 4:10)
- **Sufficient** (always enough, always adequate there is never a shortage) (2Cor 12:9)
- We begin by grace through faith (Eph 2:8, 9),
- We run daily **by grace through faith** (Col 2:6with 2Co 5:7, Hab 2:4, Ro 1:17, Heb 10:38)
- We finish by grace through faith (Rev 22:21).


The difference between grace, mercy, and peace:

Matt 16:24

24 Then Jesus said to His disciples, "If anyone wishes to come after Me, he must deny himself, and take up his cross and follow Me."

The fact that we are saved by **grace** does not give us an excuse to sin but it does give us a reason to obey.

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"Ungodliness" - means lack of reverence toward God. In the NT it describes those living without regard for God. They conduct themselves in such a way as to effectively deny God's existence and right as Supreme Ruler and Authority.

Rom 1:18

18 For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men who suppress the truth in unrighteousness,

"Ungodliness is failing to give God His due place in our hearts and lives. It is disregarding His precepts and commands. It is having preference for the creature, loving pleasure more than holiness; being unconcerned whether my conduct pleases or displeases the Lord. There are many forms of ungodliness besides that of open infidelity and the grosser crimes of wickedness. We are guilty of ungodliness when we are prayerless. We are guilty of ungodliness when we look to and lean upon the creature; or when we fail to see God's hand in providence—ascribing our blessings to "luck" or "chance." We are guilty of ungodliness when we grumble at the weather."

"Worldly desires" -

- 1. Are passions for the pleasures and pursuits of this present passing world.
- 2. Are motivated by an anti-God mind-set.
- 3. They originate in the flesh and refuse to submit to God.
- 4. They are strong attractions that are fed by the corrupt, decaying world system and drive for passing pleasure.

"Worldly desires are those affections and appetites which dominate and regulate the man of the world. It is the heart craving worldly objects, pleasures, honors, riches. It is an undue absorption with those things which serve only a temporary purpose and use. Worldly lusts cause the things of Heaven to be crowded out by the interests and concerns of earth."

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"sensibly" – means using good judgment, self-controlled, self-restrained.

- "righteously" means being in accordance with what God requires, manifesting right conduct, waking morally upright outwardly or in a right way which is in accordance with what God requires.
 - i.e. whatever God says about how to live = "righteous".
- "godly" means to live so as to render to God the reverence and worship associated with a holy life. It is to have reverence for God, and a life of holiness in the world. To live godly is to live with a reverent awareness of God's sovereignty over every aspect of one's life, with the determination to honor him in all our conduct.
