
CLIFF-HANGER #3

Gate (sa'ar) - the main entrance to a city. The gate of the city was the place of rule, where all matters were settled, all transfers made, public business took place. They didn't have courthouses, notary publics, or signatures on file in computers. If the elders of the city made a decision, it would stand.

What took place at "the Gate"?

- 1. Elders of the city would meet to:
 - Hear disputes and legal matters, weigh the evidence, and render a decision.
 - Act as witnesses on a variety of transactions.
- 2. Gather to buy and sell, to barter, to negotiate, to cut a deal.
- 3. To talk, to socialize, to catch the latest news.

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Heb 11:31

31 By faith Rahab the harlot did not perish along with those who were disobedient, after she had welcomed the spies in peace.

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THERE WERE TWO IMPORTANT MARKS THAT WERE TO DISTINGUISH THE ISRAELITES:

- 1. Those in the line of Abraham-Isaac, Jacob, Jacob's twelve sons, and the families that descended from them, were given special promises. So the family lines were of critical importance.
- 2. When the exodus took place and God sent the people out of Egypt, he sent them back to a land that he had promised them. The land of Israel was to be the land of the Jews.
- **Therefore provision was made in the Law for the way families were to protect themselves and their descendants, and for the land to be preserved, not sold and thereby passed into the hands of others. When Boaz speaks to Mr. No-Name, he raises both issues. The land is under threat of loss, it must be sold, and they need to act so it doesn't leave their family. And the family name and line are going to die out.

Ruth + Mr. No-Name child child(ren)

He has to depart with his own money to redeem (purchase) the land. If another child comes into the picture through Ruth and Mr. No-Name, then Ruth's land will go to the child and Mr. No-Name is out the money he paid for the land and thus has less to give his own children, which came from a previous marriage.

- 7 Now this was the custom in former times in Israel concerning the redemption and the exchange of land to confirm any matter: a man removed his sandal and gave it to another; and this was the manner of attestation in Israel.
- 8 So the closest relative said to Boaz, "Buy it for yourself." And he removed his sandal.
- 9 Then Boaz said to the elders and all the people, "You are witnesses today that I have bought from the hand of Naomi all that belonged to Elimelech and all that belonged to Chilion and Mahlon.
- 10 "Moreover, I have acquired Ruth the Moabitess, the widow of Mahlon, to be my wife in order to raise up the name of the deceased on his inheritance, so that the name of the deceased will not be cut off from his brothers or from the court of his birth place; you are witnesses today."
- 11 All the people who were in the court, and the elders, said, "We are witnesses. May the Lord make the woman who is coming into your home like Rachel and Leah, both of whom built the house of Israel; and may you achieve wealth in Ephrathah and become famous in Bethlehem.
- 12 "Moreover, may your house be like the house of Perez whom Tamar bore to Judah, through the offspring which the Lord will give you by this young woman."



"Sandals"

- Sandals were the ordinary footwear of the culture.
- Sandals were also a symbolic piece of clothing, especially between a widow, her land, and a potential kinsmanredeemer.
- Land was purchased based on whatever size triangle of land the buyer could walk off in an hour, a day, a week or a month.
- Land was surveyed in triangles, and a benchmark was constructed of fieldstones to serve as a boundary marker.
- Since they walked off the land in sandals, the sandals became the symbolic title to that land.
- By removing the sandals of her guardian, a widow removed his authorization to administer the land of her household.
- Therefore the passing of the sandal symbolized Boaz's right to walk on the land as his property


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
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

Ira Stanphill 1914 – 1993

Ira and his family spent most of his younger years in Coffeyville, Kansas. He was saved when he was 12. By the age of 10, Stanphill had already become a fluent musician, having learned to play the piano, organ, ukulele, and accordion. He went on to learn to play xylophone, guitar, saxophone, and clarinet. At 17, he was composing and performing his own music for church services, revival campaigns, and prayer meetings. Stanphill began preaching when he was 22. He became an evangelist, traveling to churches and Bible camps around the country, sometimes accompanied by his wife. They played and sang some of his compositions in addition to his preaching. In 1941, they joined the team of evangelist Raymond T. Richey. An ad for a crusade Stanphill held in 1964 described him as "Preacher of Old Time Religion." In addition to traveling throughout the United States, he preached in 40 other countries. In the 1970s, Stanphill's ministry included a 30minute weekly television program. Young At Heart originated on WCFC in Chicago. In the 1990s, he appeared on several Southern gospel music videos produced by Bill Gaither. Stanphill composed more than 500 gospel songs.
