- 7.5 miles long X 6 miles wide.
- Rough terrain, rocky, hills.
- Moderate climate: Summer 85/74 Winter 58/49
 Rainy season: Nov. February
- Now has population of approx. 3,000.

 - 1. Monastery of St. John
 - 2. Cave of the Apocalypse

Purpose of the Book

To give believers, in advance, a view of how Jesus Christ judges the church, how He will judge the world, and how He becomes King, resulting in believers being called to holiness, godliness, and faithfulness.

Content of the Book of Revelation

- There are 278 allusions to the OT.
- There are no direct quotes from the OT.
- John assumes therefore that the reader understands and is familiar with the rest of the Bible.
- Revelation is the only prophetic book in the NT.
- Revelation gives God's view of history.
















Prophecy can be either:

Why is the book of revelation ignored?

- 1. Because it is too difficult to understand.
- 2. Because it is not taken literally.
- 3. Because pastors come from seminaries where they are taught to ignore it.
- 4. Because it takes time, study and hard work.
- 5. Because of sign-chasers and date setters/teasers.

ABUSED


- 1. Prophecy has been used to sell books, tapes, CDs, DVDs, magazines, movies, conferences, etc.
- 2. Making it sensational have people hanging on the latest sign or newspaper headline.
- 3. Set dates that prove false and do damage to the truth of God's Word.

1. Lack of Biblical understanding.


Comprehensive Biblical View of Future Prophetic Events



Preterism



of the events described in Revelation were fulfilled in the first century with the fall of the city of Jerusalem in 70 A.D.

Full Preterism

Hyper • *Extreme* • *Orthodox* • *Consistent*

- The second coming has already happened.
- The resurrection of dead believers has already taken place.
- We're currently living in the New Heaven and New Earth.
- If there is an end to history, it isn't revealed in the Bible.

Partial Preterism

The tribulation period and the majority of Biblical prophecies were fulfilled in the events surrounding 70 A.D.

The Historicist View

The events of Revelation are being fulfilled in the present and are a panorama of church history from the time of the apostles to the second coming of Jesus.

The Idealist View

The book of Revelation is timeless. Idealists believe that Revelation depicts a battle between the church and the world at all times in church history.


The Futurist View

Revelation 4-22 describes real people and events who are yet to appear on the world scene at the end of history.


Three Views of the Millennium

- **Amillennialism** There will be no literal, visible millennium.
- **Postmillennialism** Jesus will return at the end of the millennium which will be established by the preaching of the gospel.
 - **Premillennialism** Christ will return and setup His millennial kingdom on Earth and reign over it for 1,000 years.


