

"deeds" – $\epsilon\rho\gamma\sigma\nu$ = acts that are done, performed, or accomplished. Titus 2:13-14

- 13 looking for the blessed hope and the appearing of the glory of our great God and Savior, Christ Jesus,
- 14 who gave Himself for us to redeem us from every lawless deed, and to purify for Himself a people for His own possession, zealous for good <u>deeds</u>.

Titus 3:8

8 This is a trustworthy statement; and concerning these things I want you to speak confidently, so that those who have believed God will be careful to engage in good **deeds**.

Heb 10:24

24 and let us consider how to stimulate one another to love and good deeds,

James 3:13

13 Who among you is wise and understanding? Let him show by his good behavior his deeds in the gentleness of wisdom.

"toil" – $\kappa o \pi o \sigma$ = to work to the point of weariness.

1 Cor 4:11-13

- 11 To this present hour we are both hungry and thirsty, and are poorly clothed, and are roughly treated, and are homeless;
- 12 and we **toil**, working with our own hands; when we are reviled, we bless; when we are persecuted, we endure;
- 13 when we are slandered, we try to conciliate; we have become as the scum of the world, the dregs of all things, even until now.

"perseverance" – υπομονη = the ability to endure.

Who they are:

Matt 18:15-17

- 15 "If your brother sins, go and show him his fault in private; if he listens to you, you have won your brother.
- 16 "But if he does not listen to you, <u>take one or two more with you</u>, so that BY THE MOUTH OF TWO OR THREE WITNESSES EVERY FACT MAY BE CONFIRMED.
- 17 "If he refuses to listen to them, <u>tell it to the church</u>; and if he refuses to listen even to the church, <u>let him be to you as a Gentile and a tax collector</u>

1 Tim 1:3-4

3 As I urged you upon my departure for Macedonia, remain on at Ephesus so that <u>you</u> may instruct certain men not to teach strange doctrines,

Eph 5:11

11 Do not participate in the unfruitful deeds of darkness, but instead even <u>expose</u> them;

1 Tim 1:19-20

- 19 keeping faith and a good conscience, which some have rejected and suffered shipwreck in regard to their faith.

- "I have learned that certain people . . . have passed your way with evil doctrine, but you did not allow them to sow it among you. You covered up your ears in order to avoid receiving the things being sown by them."

The believers at Ephesus said -

- 1. We don't want numbers for the sake of numbers.
- 2. We don't want growth at the expense of holiness.
- 3. We don't want those to come and teach and preach in our church regardless how many doctorate degrees they have.
- 4. We don't want those who will come with slick talk and clever speech who will give a "feel good" message.
- 5. We don't want those who come with techniques and marketing strategies straight out of the culture of this world.

- When we measure spirituality by performance of duties rather than the condition of the heart.
- When time at church is more of a checklist than a relationship.
- When business meetings are filled with statistics but devoid of God 's Word.
- When our service for Christ is motivated more out of duty than our love for Him.
- When we are no longer moved by the preaching and teaching of God's Word.
- When people remain in a church after the Lord Jesus removes the candlestick.
- When the coming of the new building or new programs or new worship leader is more anticipated than the coming of Christ.

The church has left its first love -

- When we love the church more than we love the Lord Jesus.
- When people leave the church services asking, "Was the service a success?" rather than "Was God pleased?"
- When worship and music turns from adoration to entertainment.
- When worship services become a "production."
- When there is more talk and praise for the church and its activities than for Christ.
- When the "success" of the church becomes more important than obedience to the Word.
- When more time is spent on organizing and planning than on prayer and Bible study.
- When we are more concerned with what we will be fed at the potluck than what we will be fed from the Word.

3 Step Process:

- 1. Remember
- 5 'Therefore remember from where you have fallen,

Remember what your relationship with Christ used to be.

- 2. Repent
- 5 and repent


Confess your sin. Change the way you're thinking.


- 3. Return
- 5 and do the deeds you did at first;

Begin seeing and doing the things you used to do.

- The word "remove", **kiveo**, means —"to set in motion", "to move". We get our English word "kinetic" from it.
- So Christ is saying that He will begin to set in motion the removal of the church from a sphere of blessing, from being effective in discipleship and evangelism, and from being a pillar of the truth to the world round it. He eventually will take it out of existence totally.

"Nicolaitans"

- 14 'But I have a few things against you, because you have there some who hold the teaching of Balaam, who kept teaching Balak to put a stumbling block before the sons of Israel, to eat things sacrificed to idols and to commit acts of immorality.
- 15 'So you also have some who in the same way hold the teaching of the Nicolaitans.
- This was an antinomian, lawless sect that advocated license in Christian conduct, and unrestrained indulgence in sexual immorality.

"Overcomer" in Revelation

- 1. To him who overcomes, I will grant to eat of the tree of life which is in the Paradise of God (2:7).
- 2. He who overcomes will not be hurt by the second death (2:11).
- 3. To him who overcomes, to him I will give *some* of the hidden manna, and I will give him a white stone, and a new name written on the stone which no one knows but he who receives it (2:17).
- 4. He who overcomes, and he who keeps my deeds until the end, to him I will give authority over the nations; and he shall rule them with a rod of iron, as the vessels of the potter are broken to pieces, as I also have received *authority* from my father; and I will give him the morning star (2:26-28).
- 5. He who overcomes will thus be clothed in white garments; and I will not erase his name from the book of life, and I will confess his name before My Father and before His angels (3:5).
- 6. He who overcomes, I will make him a pillar in the temple of My God, and he will not go out from it anymore; and I will write on him the name of My God, and the name of the city of My God, the new Jerusalem, which comes down out of heaven from My God, and My new name (3:12).
- 7. He who overcomes, I will grant to him to sit down with Me on My throne, as I also overcame and sat down with My Father on His throne (3:21).

Frederick Whitfield (1827-1904)

This author, being the youngest child of Thomas and Jane Whitfield, was born January 7, 1827 at Threapwood in Shropshire, England. He was brought up in close connection with the gospel of God's grace and was saved early in life.

He graduated from Trinity College (Dublin University) in 1859 and became a deacon in the Church of England.

Mr. Whitfield was first married in 1861 to Miss Sarah Garforth who died five years later, leaving him with three small children. He remarried in 1871 to Miss Sophia Butler who died after twelve years, three small children being left of this marriage. In 1899 his health began to fail, so he retired to spend his closing days at Norwood, England. He became absent from the body and present with the Lord on September 13, 1904. He was buried beside his second wife in Kensal Green Cemetery, London. Fredrick wrote more than 30 hymns.
