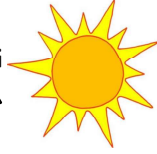

"I am . . . the Bright and Morning Star" (Rev. 22:16). What is the morning star? It is the herald of the dawn. This tells us of the Lord Jesus as the Coming One. Jesus is the . . . Bright and Morning Star. In a little while He is going to shine forth in glory — quietly, serenely, beautifully, to herald the coming day. This is the aspect of His coming developed by Paul through the Holy Spirit. He was used to open it more fully. He said, "For the Lord Himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trump of God: and the dead in Christ shall rise first: Then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord." (1 Thess. 4:16,17). It is Paul who tells us, "Behold, I shew you a mystery; We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed, in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trump: for the trumpet shall sound, and the dead shall be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed. For this corruptible must put on incorruption, and this mortal must put on immortality" (1 Cor. 15:51-53). That is what is going to take place when the Lord Jesus shines forth as the Bright and Morning Star."

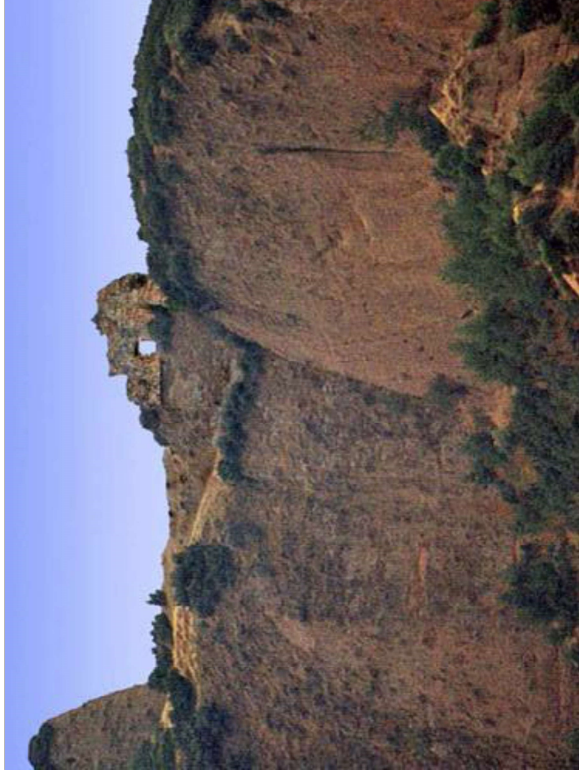
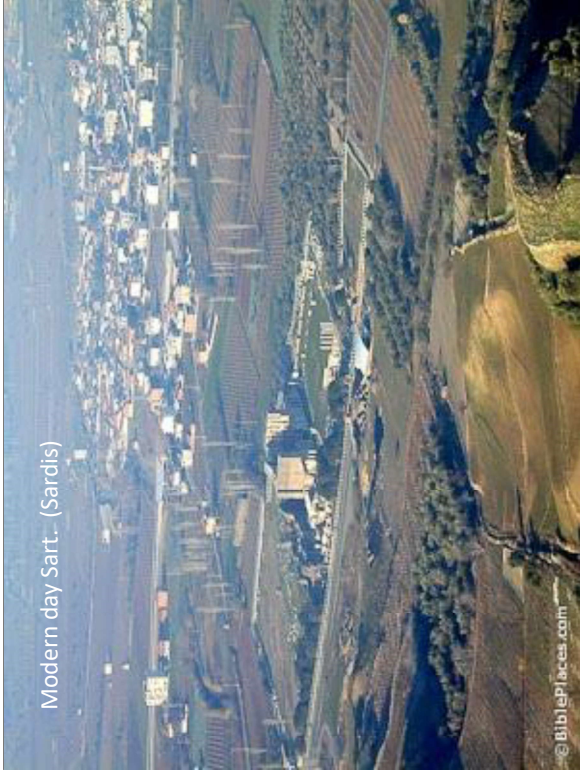

Modern day Sart. (Sardis)



City of Sardis

1. 130,000 population in its prime.
2. Due to its wealth from trade, fertile territory, gold from the Pactolus River, wool and jewelry industries, Sardis had been an economic super power in all of Asia. Gold and silver coins were said to have been first minted in Sardis. Located on 5 major trade routes. It was at one time considered the greatest city in the world.
3. Sardis was built on a mountain spur about 1500 feet above the valley floor. It was regarded as virtually impregnable to military assault. 3 sides – sheer cliffs, the 4th side only narrow steep path.
4. King – Croesus. “as rich as Croesus.” Croesus was a king who had ambitions, like most kings did, and being a very wealthy man and head of a very important city, he decided that he would also reach out and try to enlarge his kingdom. And he did that by seeking to overthrow the Persian king Cyrus.
5. The glory days for Sardis were in the past. The gold supply had run dry, it was no longer competitive in the garment industry due to the trade guilds and economic stability of Thyatira, and trade with the east had steadily declined. Sardis was dead.
6. Religiously they had temples to: Cybele, Zeus, Artemis/Diana, Emperor Tiberius (because of gift to rebuild after AD 17 earthquake)

Church at Sardis

1. No mention of its beginning in Scripture.
2. The church was likely founded during Paul's ministry at Ephesus (Acts 19:10).
3. The most prominent person from the church at Sardis known to history is Melito. He was an Apologist (one who wrote in defense of Christianity) who served as pastor of Sardis in the late second century. Wrote the first commentary on Revelation.
4. There's no mention of persecution against this church, there's no mention of bad theology, there's no mention of any false teachers, there's no mention of any compromise with the world. There's no mention of any sin. But no doubt all were true and eventually took its toll on the church.
5. It was a dead church in a dead city. “The church had become a thermometer that registered the temperature of the city instead of a thermostat that changed the temperature of the city.” The church eventually disappeared.

1. **The Lord Jesus was no longer obeyed.**

John 14:6

6 Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life;

2. **The Holy Spirit has been quenched.**

John 6:63

63 "It is the Spirit who gives life; the flesh profits nothing; the words that I have spoken to you are spirit and are life.

3. **The Word of God has been ignored.**

Heb 4:12

12 For the word of God is living and active and sharper than any two-edged sword, and piercing as far as the division of soul and spirit, of both joints and marrow, and able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart.

1 **Peter 1:23**

23 For you have been born again not of seed which is perishable but imperishable, that is, through the living and enduring word of God.

***THE CHURCH AT SARDIS HAD FAILED TO SUBMIT TO THE LORDSHIP OF CHRIST, THEY HAD QUENCHED GOD'S SPIRIT, IGNORED GOD'S WORD AND THEREFORE THEY WERE VOID OF HIS LIFE, HIS CONTROL, AND HIS INFLUENCE IN THEIR CHURCH.**

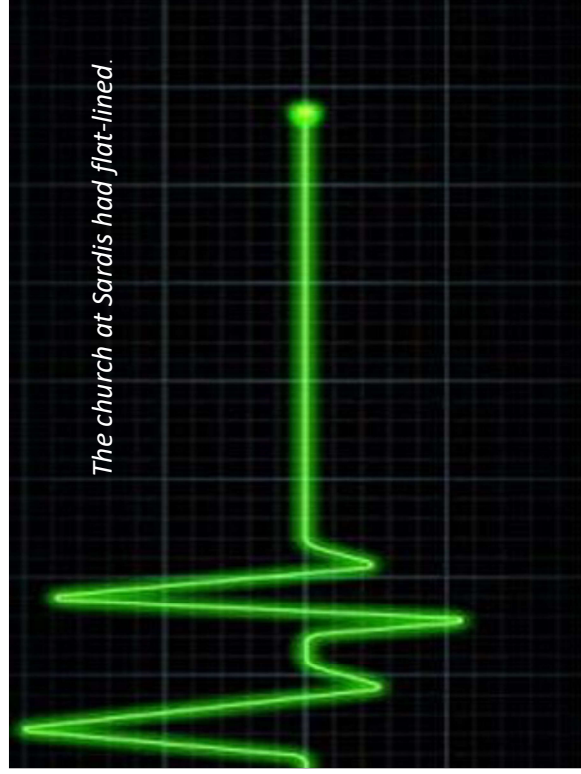

struggles going on within it.

- There were no Jewish accusers.
- There were no false apostles.
- There were no false teachers.
- There were no Nicolaitans, as there were at Pergamum.
- There were no female seducers, as was Jezebel at Thyatira.
- There was nothing!

The story is told that on a Sunday morning someone had a heart attack while sitting in church. The church called 911 and the church was so dead that the paramedics carried out the first 7 rows of people before they found the right person.

So what does a dead church look like?

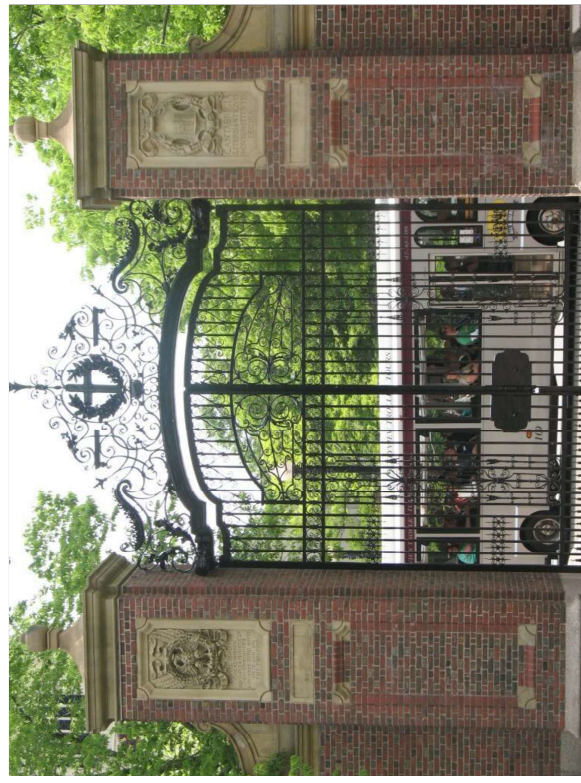
Charles Swindoll writes...

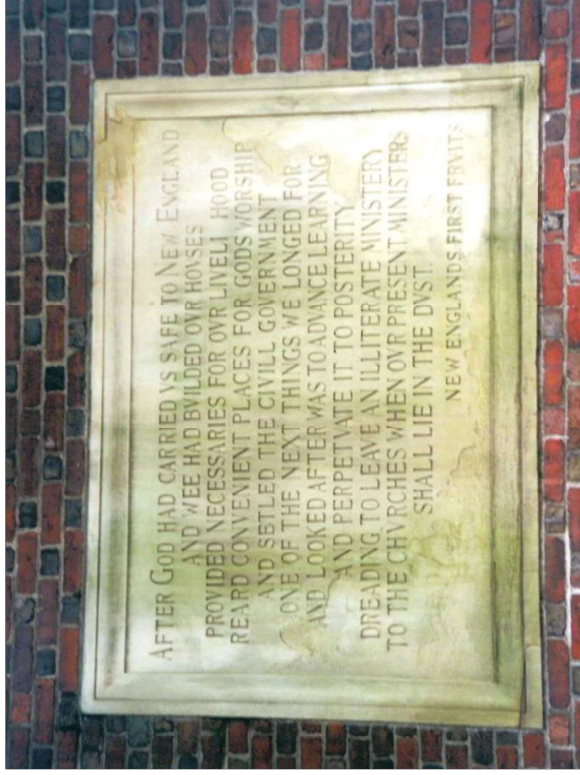
- The pastor graduated from a theological cemetery.
- The choir director moonlights as the local coroner.
- They sing, “Embalmed in Gilead” and “Amazing Grave, How Sweet the Ground.”
- At the Rapture, they’ll be the first churches taken up because the Bible says, “The dead in Christ will rise first.”
- They drive to church in one long line with their headlights on. Whenever someone joins their membership, the church office immediately notifies the next of kin.
- Each week they put an ad in the obituaries. The church van is a black hearse and the church sign is a tombstone. Their motto is, “Many are cold and a few are frozen.”
- The church of Sardis was simply a morgue with a steeple!

8 signs of a dying church?

- A dying church rests on its past accomplishments and is satisfied with its present state.
- A dying church is more concerned about their rituals and their formalities than they are about spirituality.
- A dying church is more concerned about social change than they are about seeing people changed by the power of God.
- A dying church is more concerned with material growth than it is with spiritual growth.
- A dying church is more concerned with pleasing men that it is with pleasing God.
- A dying church clings more tightly to its creeds and confessions than it does to the Word of God.
- A dying church is one that loses its conviction that the Bible is the Word of God.
- A dying church no longer “contends for the faith”. There is no “fight” left in her.

Look at our ivy league schools – Harvard, Yale Princeton, Dartmouth, & Columbia. Schools that were created to promote and educate the life of God and Jesus Christ, and the priority of God’s Word in a person’s life, are now dead institutions who now undermine and discredit all of the above.

"White Robes"

1. In the ancient world white robes sometimes stood for victory. The general who won the battle wore white and those who helped him win the battle. So those faithful who have won the victory over sin and death and hell through Christ will receive rewards at the Bema and they there will be clothed in white.
2. The whiteness of these new garments represents holiness and purity. Christ Himself wears a white garment (Matt 17:2; Mark 9:3), unfallen angels wear white garments (Rev 15:6), and the bride of Christ will be wearing white clean linens (Rev 19:8, 14).

Rev 19:7-8

- 7 "Let us rejoice and be glad and give the glory to Him, for the marriage of the Lamb has come and His bride has made herself ready."

Alfred Henry Ackley
1887-1960

Alfred Henry Ackley was born 21 January 1887 in Spring Hill, Pennsylvania. He was the youngest son of Stanley Frank Ackley and the younger brother of B. D. Ackley. His father taught him music and he also studied at the Royal Academy of Music in London. He graduated from Westminster Theological Seminary in Maryland and was ordained as a Presbyterian minister in 1914. He served churches in Pennsylvania and California. He also worked with the Billy Sunday and Homer Rodeheaver evangelist team and for Homer Rodeheaver's publishing company. He wrote around 1500 hymns. He died 3 July 1960 in Los Angeles.
