



"The Great Multitude"

Oct. 1, 2017






Rev 22:7

Purpose of the Book

To give believers, in advance, a view of how Jesus Christ judges the church, how He will judge the world, and how He becomes King, resulting in believers being called to holiness, godliness, and faithfulness.


"nation" = culture

3 And I will bless those who bless you,


And the one who curses you I will curse.



Robes of emotion -

1. The torn robe of Job - sorrow.

Job 1:19-22

- 19 and behold, a great wind came from across the wilderness and struck the four corners of the house, and it fell on the young people and they died, and I alone have escaped to tell you."
- 20 Then Job arose and tore his robe and shaved his head, and he fell to the ground and worshiped.
- 21 He said,

"Naked I came from my mother's womb,

And naked I shall return there.

The Lord gave and the Lord has taken away.

Blessed be the name of the Lord."

22 Through all this Job did not sin nor did he blame God.

2. The long robe of hypocrisy - anger.

Luke 20:46-47

- 46 "Beware of the scribes, who like to walk around in long robes, and love respectful greetings in the market places, and chief seats in the synagogues and places of honor at banquets,
- 47 who devour widows' houses, and for appearance's sake offer long prayers. These will receive greater condemnation."

3. The scarlet robe of mockery - sympathy.

Matt 27:28-31

- 28 They stripped Him and put a scarlet robe on Him.
- 29 And after twisting together a crown of thorns, they put it on His head, and a reed in His right hand; and they knelt down before Him and mocked Him, saying, "Hail, King of the Jews!"
- 30 They spat on Him, and took the reed and began to beat Him on the head.
- 31 After they had mocked Him, they took the scarlet robe off Him and put His own garments back on Him, and led Him away to crucify Him.

4. The white robe of righteousness - joy.

Isa 61:10

10 I will rejoice greatly in the Lord,
My soul will exult in my God;
For He has clothed me with garments of salvation,
He has wrapped me with a robe of righteousness,
As a bridegroom decks himself with a garland,
And as a bride adorns herself with her jewels.

"clothed in white robes"

- 1. λευκοσ στολασ- white stole describes a dazzling, brilliant, shining white. An outer garment, worn for dignity, and grace, and beauty, and distinction.
- 2. "white" honor, dignity, righteousness, purity and holiness.
- 3. White robes in that day were marks of festival rejoicing associated with victory. Generals and commanders wore white robes in a victory parade after battle.
- 4. Here the robes indicate not only victory for faith, but also the righteousness obtained through the death of Christ.
- So who gets a white robe?
- They have no righteousness in themselves.
- The righteousness that they have was given to them. It came from an outside source. An alien righteousness.
- It is a righteousness that was obtained by the perfect life that Christ lived in full obedience to the Law.
- Therefore very believer gets a white robe.

Why Palm branches?

Palm branches were symbols of joy by those observing a feast or watching a triumphal procession.

Lev 23:39-40

- 39 'On exactly the fifteenth day of the seventh month, when you have gathered in the crops of the land, you shall celebrate the feast of the Lord for seven days, with a rest on the first day and a rest on the eighth day.
- 40 'Now on the first day you shall take for yourselves the foliage of beautiful trees, palm branches and boughs of leafy trees and willows of the brook, and you shall rejoice before the Lord your God for seven days.

John 12:12-13

- 12 On the next day the large crowd who had come to the feast, when they heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem,
- 13 took the branches of the palm trees and went out to meet Him, and began to shout, "Hosanna! BLESSED IS HE WHO COMES IN THE NAME OF THE LORD, even the King of Israel."

Do they have resurrected bodies?

In Revelation the wearing of a white robe does not require a resurrection body.

Bodiless souls could wear a robe. . . .

Consider the following:

- When the rich man of Luke 16 died, his body was buried (Luke 16:22), and his soul went to hell (Luke 16:23). Even though his soul was without its body, Jesus ascribed eyes (Luke 16:23) and a tongue (Luke 16:24) to his bodiless soul.
- The angels do not have physical bodies by nature, but the Bible ascribes wings, faces, feet, and hands to them (Isa. 6:2, 6; Rev. 10:1-2+, 5+, 8+, 10+) and portrays them wearing clothing (Mat. 28:2-3; Mark 16:5; Acts 1:10; Rev. 15:6+). . . . **Although the Bible ascribes such things as hands, feet, faces, tongues, and the wearing of clothing to human, angelic, and divine beings, it does not mean that those beings have literal, physical bodies such as resurrected people have.

Jonah 2:9

Notice how the redemption of the unsaved is so complete that they can worship side by side with the heavenly creatures.

Let it be established."

There will be a permanent ongoing worship of the majesty of God throughout all eternity.

Julia Harriet Johnston 1849-1919

This hymn was written by Julia Harriette Johnston. She was born on January 21, 1849 in Ohio. At the age of six, she moved to Peoria, IL where she resided the remainder of her life. Her father, Robert Johnston, was a Presbyterian minister. Her mother founded the Presbyterian Missionary Society of Peoria and Julia served as president for over twenty years. She also wrote Sunday School lessons for David C. Cook Publishing Company. Over the years she authored several books including Indian and Spanish Neighbors (1905) and Fifty Missionary Heroes (1913). She wrote over 500 hymns, including Trust in Jesus, Praise the Redeemer and What Would Jesus Have You Do?. She worked with various composers over the years to set music to her poems.



Julia Harriet Johnston 1849-1919

Daniel Brink Towner composed the music for this hymn that Julia wrote. He was born on March 5, 1850 and began studying music under his father at a young age. He served as music director for a variety of churches before becoming music director at Moody Bible Institute in Chicago, IL. He composed over 2000 hymns including At Calvary, O Grace of God so Boundless, Send Out the Light and Anywhere with Jesus.

The hymn that Julia wrote . . .

GRACE GREATER THAN ALL OUR SIN

Marvelous grace of our loving Lord,
 Dark is the Grace that exceeds our sin and our guilt! cannot hide.

Yonder on Calvary's mount outpoured,

There where the blood of the Lamb was away? spilled. Look!

Grace, grace, God's grace, Grace that will pardon and cleanse within;

Grace, grace, God's grace, Grace that is greater than all our sin.
