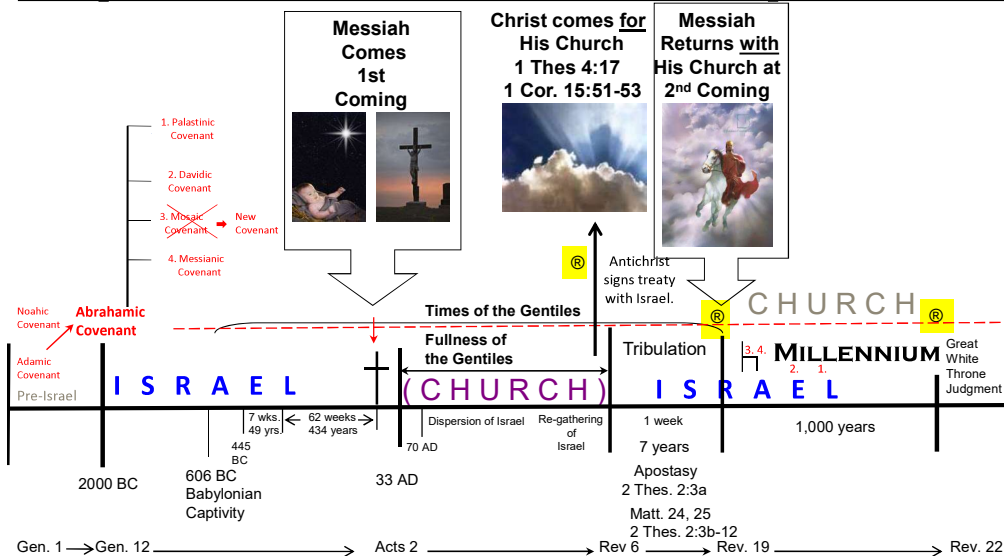

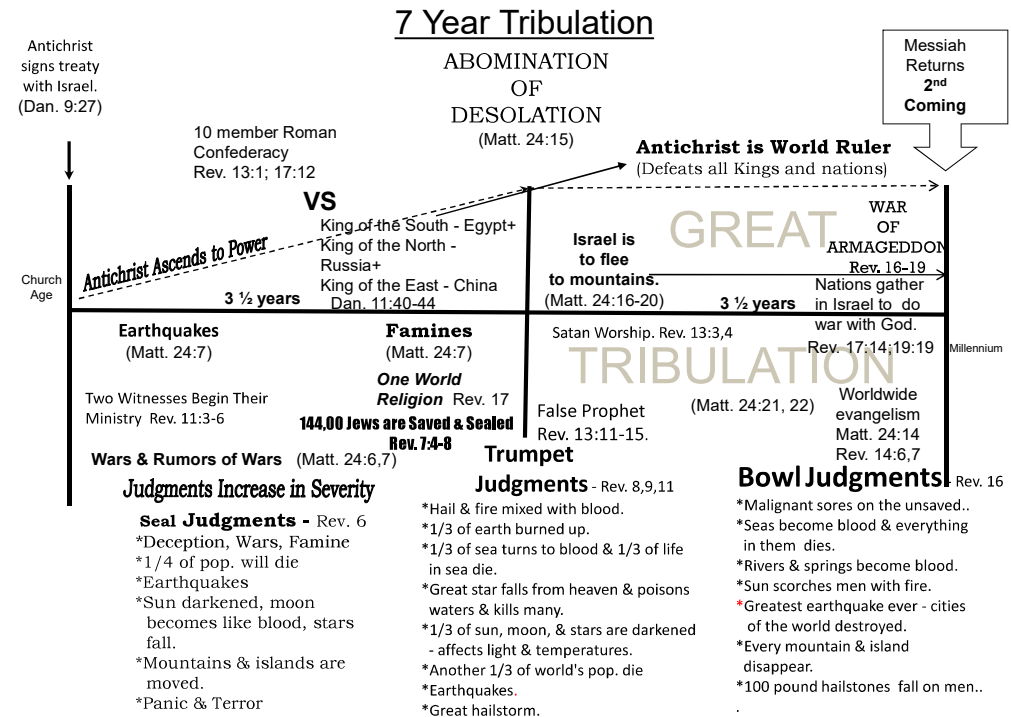

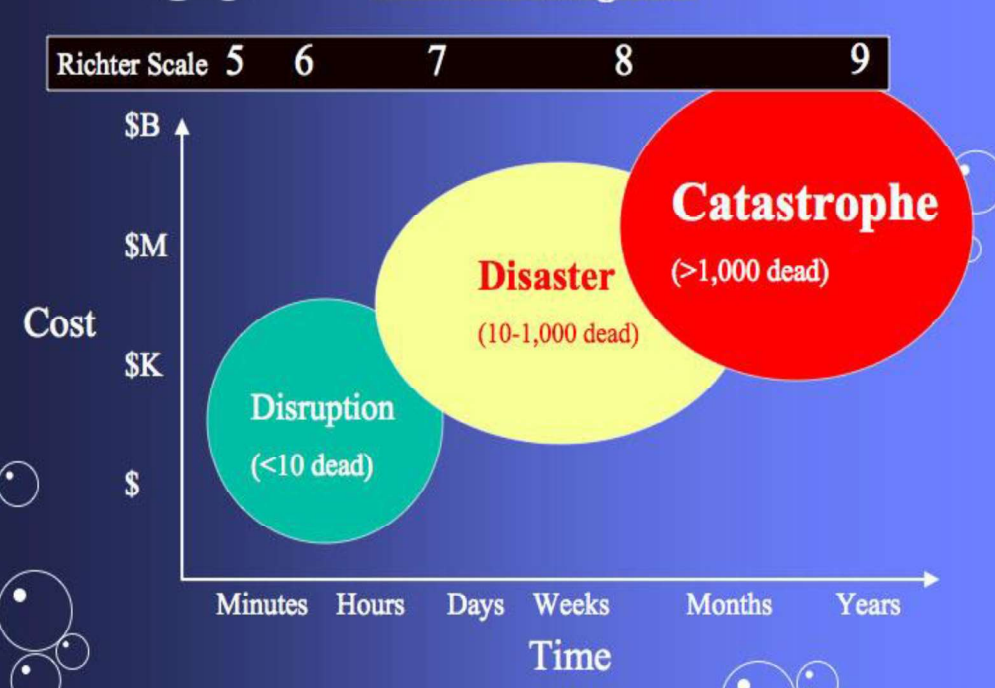

Incident Categories



- There is no theoretical limit to the magnitude of an earthquake, although it is estimated that an earthquake of magnitude 11 would split the Earth in two.
- Beyond 9.5, while extremely strong earthquakes are theoretically possible, the energies involved rapidly make such earthquakes on Earth effectively impossible without an extremely destructive source of external energy.

9.0 and greater

At or near total destruction – severe damage or collapse to all buildings. Heavy damage and shaking extends to distant locations. Permanent changes in ground topography.

Changes to the typography:

Zech 14:8-10

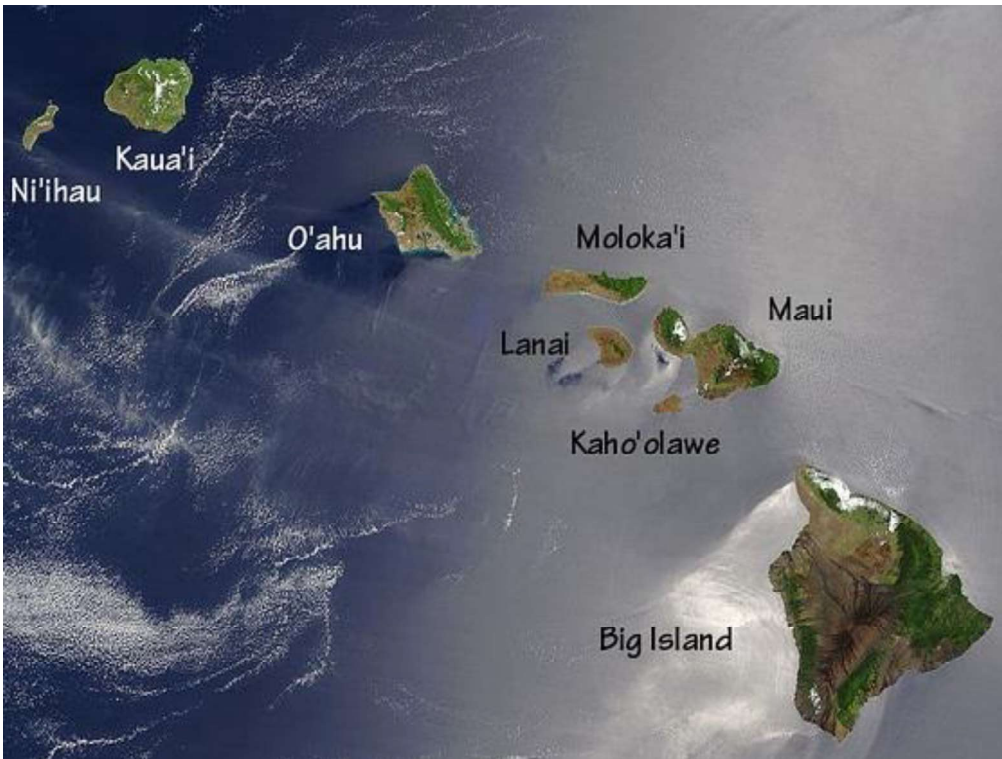
3. "Babylon the great was remembered before God to give her the cup of the wine of the wrath of God."

- **Babylon** refers to the re-built city of Babylon on the banks of the Euphrates River in modern day Iraq.
- This city began at Babel.
- It has corrupted the world through every possible avenue; government (politics), religion, and economy (materialism).
- God will remember that it is time to utterly annihilate this kingdom.



4. "every island disappeared "

- There are about 120,000 islands in the oceans of the world and approx. 2,000,000 total in all bodies of water.
- The population of the world's islands is over 730 million, approximately 11% of the world's total population.
- Under the 6th Seal a great earthquake "moved" every island (Rev 6:14)
- This earthquake will be much greater and it literally causes all the islands of the world to disappear.





4. *“every island disappeared “*

- There are about 120,000 islands in the oceans of the world and approx. 2,000,000 total in all bodies of water.

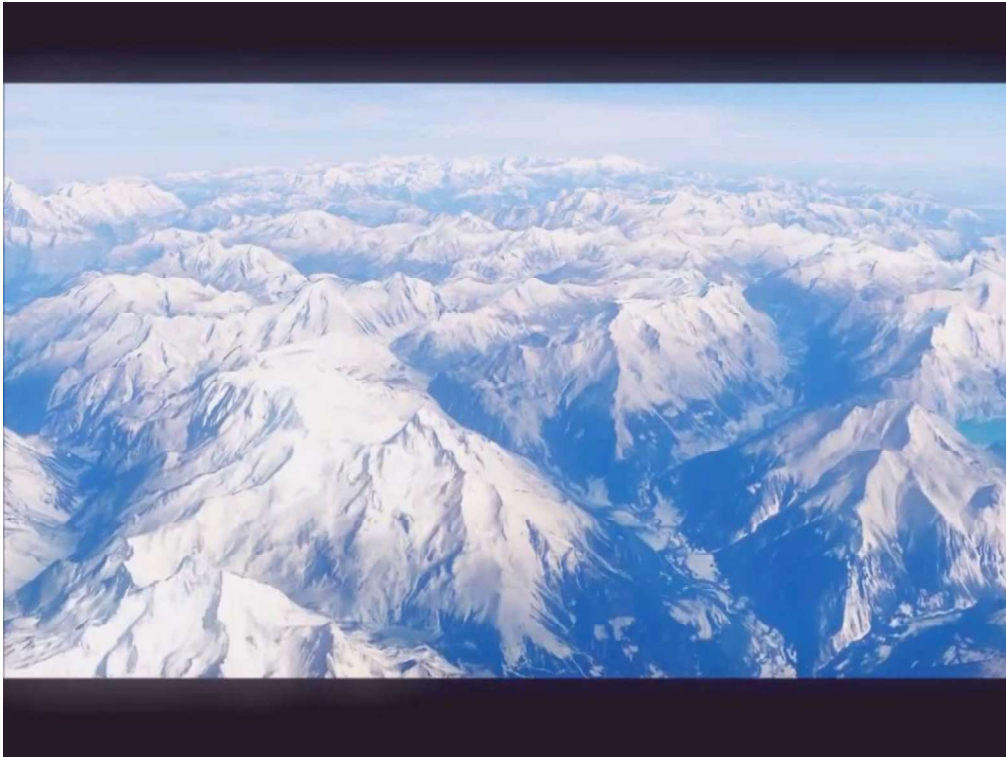

- A 100 pound hailstone would be the size of approx. 2 basketballs put together – about 29 " in diameter.
- It will hit the earth at a speed of approx. 370 mph.
- It will explode like a grenade or bomb – with shrapnel, (shards and splinters of ice) going everywhere.
- They will go through the roof of a house, smash cars, kill people, demolish everything in its path, and crush and pulverize whatever was left from the earthquake.



“The weight, size and speed of this great hail are unbelievable. One piece of hail is comparable to today's modern weaponry. However, it will not be a few pieces of hail here and there but possibly hundreds of thousands or millions of pieces of hail. Remember the white lawn after a normal hail storm? Entire cities will be smashed beneath the persistent blows of these mortars from heaven. Now, what weaponry, what arsenal that man currently possesses comes close to these characteristics? None!”

Cleland B. McAfee
(1866-1944)

This is a tragic story. However, a wonderful song was born during the human suffering and sadness told about in this narrative. It took place in Parkville, Missouri in the early 1900s. Dr. Cleland McAfee (1866-1944), a Presbyterian minister who served for many years on the faculty of Park College, a church-related school, was also a pastor who served several churches. He found that unexpected problems or crises may come into our lives. We often cannot escape the pressures and shadows that accompany those problems. However, they can be faced with spiritual strength, which God provides. This is the message expressed in the song told about in this story. When tragedy struck a family, it was natural that they would turn to McAfee, the pastor, for consolation. The affliction told about in this story came much closer to his heart and it was two-fold. In 1903, two of his brother's young daughters succumbed to diphtheria. They died within 24 hours of each other.

The choir learned the new song at their regular Saturday evening practice. From there, they went to the quarantined home of the Howard McAfee family and sang the new hymn beneath the darkened windows. They also shared the song with the congregation at the Communion Service, the following day. It has been more than a century since McAfee penned the words of this hymn, yet Christians today find them as comforting as did the people of that earlier time. We, too, need a place of rest, a place of comfort, a place where all is joy and peace. "The Lord is near to all who call upon him, to all who call upon him in truth. -Psalm 145:18 The name of this hymn is . . .



Cleland B. McAfee
(1866-1944)

The double catastrophe broke McAfee's heart. However, the situation was made even more difficult by the fact that his brother's house had to be quarantined to prevent the spread of terrifying diphtheria. People were unable to go inside to express their condolences, and the family could not be permitted to leave the house to attend funeral services. You might ask, "How could it have been worse?" McAfee sat up very late, praying and pondering what he could say in a sermon the following Sunday and what kind of music he could compose to bring comfort to his family and the congregation. The wonderful hymn presented in this story was the outcome of his meditation.
