

• Punishment is always required for sin committed.

Punishment -

Ps 28:4

- Why pay her back double?
- Because as her sins were overflowing so her punishment will be overflowing.
- God will measure out twice as much judgment on Babylon because of the enormity of her sin.
- αποδιδωμι(apodidomi) means literally "to pay a debt" or "to give back that which is due." It is the law of retribution. This is what is owed, therefore this is what should be paid back. The punishment should always fit the crime.
- God has always operated this way both in punishment and reward.

Ex 22:4

"If what he stole is actually found alive in his possession, whether an ox or a donkey or a sheep, he shall pay double.

Ex 22:7

7 If a man gives his neighbor money or goods to keep for him and it is stolen from the man's house, if the thief is caught, he shall pay double.

Ex 22:9

9 "For every breach of trust, whether it is for ox, for donkey, for sheep, for clothing, or for any lost thing about which one says, 'This is it,' the case of both parties shall come before the judges; he whom the judges condemn shall pay double to his neighbor.


Hedonism – the pursuit of pleasure. It is sensual selfindulgence. The belief that pleasure is the highest good and proper aim of human life.

Narcissism – excessive interest in oneself. Extreme selfishness.


• The city of Babylon in the Tribulation will be the apex, the peak of hedonism and narcissism.

1. How hedonistic is our society today?




2. How narcisstic is our culture today?



What drives the scale?

 The law of diminishing returns: Desires once achieved don't provide the same pleasures & satisfaction over time, thus greater desires must be achieved.

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"for she says in her heart, 'I SIT as A QUEEN AND I AM NOT A WIDOW, and will never see mourning."

- "Not" is the double negative, oo μη the strongest negative statement in Greek. She is sure she will not ever see mourning.
- This is not reality. This is self-deception.
- She thinks everyone is madly in love with <u>her.</u>
- When in reality they are not in love with her but with what she can provide for them. Same as a prostitute.

Isa 47:1-11

- 1 "Come down and sit in the dust, O virgin daughter of Babylon; Sit on the ground without a throne, O daughter of the Chaldeans! For you shall no longer be called tender and delicate.
- 2 "Take the millstones and grind meal. Remove your veil, strip off the skirt, Uncover the leg, cross the rivers.
- 3 "Your nakedness will be uncovered, Your shame also will be exposed; I will take vengeance and will not spare a man."
- 4 Our Redeemer, the Lord of hosts is His name, The Holy One of Israel.
- 5 "Sit silently, and go into darkness, O daughter of the Chaldeans, For you will no longer be called The queen of kingdoms.

• As punishment, she is to be given torment and mourning which is the absolute opposite of the life she lived.

Summary –

- 1. There is no security in riches.

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"For this reason in one day her plagues will come," Normal Greek word order:

conjunction, verb, subject, object, and modifiers

 What Greek does is move words out of their "normal" order to emphasize them. Normally the movement is toward the beginning of the sentence, and the very beginning caries the greatest emphasis.

2 examples of swift judgment

Luke 12:16-21

- 16 And He told them a parable, saying, "The land of a rich man was very productive.
- 17 "And he began reasoning to himself, saying, 'What shall I do, since I have no place to store my crops?'
- 18 "Then he said, 'This is what I will do: I will tear down my barns and build larger ones, and there I will store all my grain and my goods.

 - The judgment of the City of Babylon at the end of the Tribulation, will be the perfect timing for God to display His awesome power.



Phillips Brooks was born in Boston, December 13th, 1835. He came from a long line of Puritan ancestors, many of whom had been Congregational clergymen. His parents became connected with the Episcopal Church, and he was reared in the strict ways of the Evangelical wing of that Church. He had the typical Boston education, the Latin School and then Harvard, from which he was graduated in 1855. Brooks was an American patriot, fighting for the union in the Civil War and standing against slavery. He held a Doctorate of Divinity from Oxford and taught at Yale University. Standing at 6 feet, 8 inches he was loved by young and old alike. He is reported to often be seen sitting on the floor playing with children that visited his office and keeping toys in his office for his young visitors. He soon decided to enter the ministry, and studied at Alexandria Seminary, in Virginia.



In 1859 he became pastor of a small church in Philadelphia. Here his sermons attracted much attention, and in 1861 he was called to be minister of the Church of the Holy Trinity, in the same city. In that position he remained until 1869, when his own leanings toward his native town and the urgency of repeated calls from there led him to accept the pastorate of Trinity Church, Boston. The congregation built for him the great church building in the Back Bay, and there he exercised that wonderful ministry with which many of us are familiar. In 1891 he was elected pastor of his Church in Massachusetts, and after some controversy, occasioned by his broad views in church matters, his election was confirmed and he was consecrated.



But this position he was not to fill for long. The strain of the great work he had been doing had undermined even his giant strength, and after a short sickness he passed away on January 23rd, 1893 at age 58 years.

When Phillips Brooks was pastor of Holy Trinity Church in Philadelphia, his parishioners in August 1865, sent him abroad for a year. His travels took him through Europe, and in December to the Holy Land. Here with reverent feet he traced the footsteps of his Lord and Master from Nazareth southward and visited the scenes of the Bible narrative. After two weeks spent in Jerusalem, on December 24th he made his way on horseback from Jerusalem to Bethlehem where he attended a five-hour Christmas musical praise celebration at the Church of the Nativity.



Stirring his emotions on that night, he later wrote to his Sunday school back in Philadelphia:

"I remember especially on Christmas Eve, when I was standing in the old church at Bethlehem, close to the spot where Jesus was born, when the whole church was ringing hour after hour with the splendid hymns of praise to God, how again and again it seemed as if I could hear voices that I knew well, telling each other of the 'Wonderful Night' of the Savior's birth, as I had heard the year before; and I assure you I was glad to shut my ears for a while and listen to the more familiar strains that came wandering to me halfway round the world." Two years after his return to America, still full of the thrilling memories of that magical night in Bethlehem, Phillips Brooks wrote for his Sunday school this Christmas hymn, which for a long time had been singing in his soul.



His organist put melody to his words and on Christmas Eve, 1868, this hymn was sung for the very first time. Neither Phillips Brooks nor his organist ever thought the carol or the music to it would live beyond that Christmas of 1868. The name of this hymn and Christmas carol is . . .

Phillips Brooks (1835–1893)

O LITTLE TOWN OF BETHLEHEM

- 1. O little town of Bethlehem,
- How still we see thee lie!
- Above thy deep and dreamless sleep
- The silent stars go by.
- Yet in thy dark streets shineth
- The everlasting Light;
- The hopes and fears of all the years
- Are met in thee tonight.
- 2. For Christ is born of Mary,
 And gathered all above,
 While mortals sleep, the angels keep
 Their watch of wondering love.
 O morning stars together,
 Proclaim the holy birth,
 And praises sing to God the King,
