



12 "Behold, I am coming quickly, and My reward is with Me, to render to every man according to what he has done.



Ps 71:7-18

- 7 I have become a marvel to many, For You are my strong refuge.
- 8 My mouth is filled with Your praise And with Your glory all day long.
- 9 Do not cast me off in the time of old age;
 Do not forsake me when my strength fails.

 Growing old does not mean you are no longer useful.
- 10 For my enemies have spoken against me; And those who watch for my life have consulted together,
- 11 Saying, "God has forsaken him; Pursue and seize him, for there is no one to deliver."
- 12 O God, do not be far from me; O my God, hasten to my help! Challenges come when we get older, but God is there to help.
- 13 Let those who are adversaries of my soul be ashamed and consumed; Let them be covered with reproach and dishonor, who seek to injure me.

Retirement

- The concept of retirement is less than 100 years old in the U.S.
- Germany became the first nation in the world to adopt a social insurance program - 1889.
- Germany initially set age 70 as the retirement age.
- By the time America moved to social insurance in 1935 the German system was using age 65 as its retirement age.
- That retirement age just about aligned with life expectancy in Germany then. Even with retirement, most people still worked until they died.
- President Franklin D. Roosevelt proposed the Social Security Act of 1935.
- When the Social Security Act was passed in 1935, the official retirement age was 65. Life expectancy for American men was 58 at the time.


Some problems people have with retirement.

- 1. You've got too much time on your hands and you don't know what you want to do.
- 2. You realize that a large part of your identity was associated with your work.
- 3. Depression, boredom, anxiety, loss of purpose, loss of routine, loss of productivity.

"Most people don't die of old age, they die of retirement. I read somewhere that half the men retiring in the state of New York die within 2 years. Where in the Bible do you find retirement? Did Moses retire? Did Paul retire? Did Peter or John retire? . . . How will we live our final years to show that Christ is our treasure and not the world?"


8 Watch yourselves, that you do not lose what we have accomplished, but that you may receive a full reward.


3 things that will rob you of your reward:

How do I glorify God and receive reward for using my time?


- 1. Look closely at how you now spend your time.

- 7. Remember to live a balanced life factor in rest and relaxation.




1. Time 2. Spiritual Gifts

Spiritual Gifts

- 1. A spiritual gift is a supernatural ability, sovereignly given to each believer as the result of grace, for the edifying of other believers in the body of Christ.
- 2. A spiritual gift is a spiritual capacity for development.
- 3. You have at least 1 gift.
- 4. No believer has all of the gifts.
- 5. Your spiritual gift is unique to you.
- 6. Your gift(s) combine with:
 - Other spiritual gifts.
 - Your talents.
 - Your personality.
 - Your physical characteristics.
 - · Your background.
 - Your experience.
 - Your education.
 - · Your maturity.

1 Peter 4:10-11

- 10 As each one has received a special gift, employ it in serving one another as good stewards of the manifold grace of God.
- 11 Whoever speaks, is to do so as one who is speaking the utterances of God; whoever serves is to do so as one who is serving by the strength which God supplies; so that in all things God may be glorified through Jesus Christ,

Rom 12:6-8

- 6 Since we have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, each of us is to exercise them accordingly: if prophecy, according to the proportion of his faith;
- 7 if service, in his serving; or he who teaches, in his teaching;
- 8 or he who exhorts, in his exhortation; he who gives, with liberality; he who leads, with diligence; he who shows mercy, with cheerfulness.

1 Cor 12:4-11

- 4 Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit.
- 5 And there are varieties of ministries, and the same Lord.
- 6 There are varieties of effects, but the same God who works all things in all persons.
- 7 But to each one is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good.
- 8 For to one is given the word of wisdom through the Spirit, and to another the word of knowledge according to the same Spirit;
- 9 to another faith by the same Spirit, and to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit,
- 10 and to another the effecting of miracles, and to another prophecy, and to another the distinguishing of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, and to another the interpretation of tongues.
- 11 But one and the same Spirit works all these things, distributing to each one individually just as He wills.
