



How did we interpret the Book of Revelation?

Axiom – a statement universally accepted as true. An established principle or law that needs no proof because the truth is obvious.

5 Axioms of communication:

- 1. The purpose of speech is the impartation of thought.
- 2. The purpose of interpretation is to apprehend the exact thought of the author.
- 3. Words and language are reliable mediums of communication.
- Usage determines the meaning of words. Therefore the meaning of a word depends on its association with other words.
- 5. By one expression one thought is conveyed, and only one.

Scripture is God's truth.

- It is God's truth whether you understand it or not
- It is God's truth whether you've experienced it or not.
- It is God's truth whether you have lived or not.
- The truth is not dependent on you or anyone else.
- Scripture is the same for everyone and its interpretation is the same for everyone.
- What the Bible means to you and what you think the truth is, is irrelevant to its truthfulness.
- The Bible is true whether it affects anyone or not.
- Scripture has 1 true meaning and that 1 true meaning is determined by God.
- God revealed all of His truth in 1 book and only 1 book.
- Our task then is to determine what God meant by what He has revealed in that 1 book.

Scripture is logical.

- " is subject to mental assessment.
- There are no errors.



The 6 Major Principles of Interpretation I. The principle of LITERAL interpretation.

"Understanding the meaning of a sentence in its usual, ordinary, or normal way it is used in writing or conversation."

II. The principle of **GRAMMATICAL** interpretation.

"Paying close attention to the words of a sentence - meaning, order, syntax, parts of speech, action of the verbs, are all investigated to determine what is meant by what is said."

III. The principle of HISTORICAL interpretation.

"Studying the history of a particular setting in the Bible - a nation, race, country, kingdom, city, etc."

IV. The principle of CULTURAL interpretation.


"Understanding the culture of the day in which the Bible was written - customs, traditions, dress, food, manners, entertainment, marriage, family, occupations, etc."

V. The principle of GEOGRAPHICAL interpretation.

"Studying atlases, maps, etc. to determine where a particular event or span of time took place - the climate, temperature, terrain, distance, etc."

VI. The principle of CONTEXTUAL interpretation.

"Paying close attention to the material surrounding a passage of Scripture, both before and after. Immediate, chapter, book, O.T. or N.T. all are a critical consideration as they will have great bearing on the meaning of a given word, sentence and/or passage."

Cold-Stunned Iguanas Falling From Florida Trees

MIAMI — The National Weather Service routinely warns people about falling rain, snow and hail, but temperatures are dropping so low in South Florida the forecasters warned residents Tuesday about falling iguanas.

"This isn't something we usually forecast, but don't be surprised if you see Iguanas falling from the trees tonight as lows drop into the 30s and 40s. Brrrr!" NWS Miami tweeted.

The low temperatures stun the invasive reptiles, but the iguanas won't necessarily die. That means many will wake up as temperatures rise Wednesday.

Iguanas aren't dangerous or aggressive to humans, but they damage seawalls, sidewalks, landscape foliage and can dig lengthy tunnels. The males can grow to at least 5 feet long and weigh nearly 20 pounds.

Female iguanas can lay nearly 80 eggs a year, and South Florida's warm climate is perfect for the prehistoric-looking animals. Iguanas are native to Central America, tropical parts of South America and some Caribbean islands.

Iguanas are allowed to be kept as pets in Florida but are not protected by any law except anti-cruelty to animals. They've been in South Florida since the 1960s, but their numbers have increased dramatically in recent years.





"Paying close attention to the words of a sentence - meaning, order, syntax, parts of speech, action of the verbs, are all investigated to determine what is meant by what is said." "strong angel"

- Gabriel = strength of God
- "proclaiming" κηρυσσω to hearld (public crier), to shout, to announce loudly.

"loud" – μεγασ – megas. mega – gigantic, huge. The angel wants his voice to penetrate every corner of the universe.

"worthy" – $\alpha\xi_{10\sigma}$ - axios – having weight

χρονοσ - sequential time - second, minute, hour, day, week, year. Calender time.

Καιροσ - seasons, eras, epochs. Large chunk of time.

παντοκρατωρ

- "to have strength and might over all. One who has his hand on everything. One who has a firm grip."
- It speaks of the great sovereign control of the Lord Jesus over everything – past, present, and future.
- He is Almighty in sustaining His people, yet equally Almighty in judgment on His enemies.

"παρουσια" parousia "coming (22 X) or presence (2X)"

Matt 24:3

As He was sitting on the Mount of Olives, the disciples came to Him privately, saying, "Tell us, when will these things happen, and what *will be* the sign of Your *parousia*, and of the end of the age?"

Mat 24:27

"For just as the lightning comes from the east and flashes even to the west, so will the *parousia* of the Son of Man be.

Mat 24:37

"For the *parousia* of the Son of Man will be just like the days of Noah.

Mat 24:39

and they did not understand until the flood came and took them all away; so will the *parousia* of the Son of Man be.

Christ comes WITH His saints WITH the clouds"

Rev 17:1-3

- 1 Then one of the seven angels who had the seven bowls came and spoke with me, saying, "Come here, I will show you the judgment of the great harlot who sits on many waters,
- 2 with whom the kings of the earth committed acts of immorality, and those who dwell on the earth were made drunk with the wine of her immorality."

- "immorality" $\pi o \rho v \epsilon \upsilon \omega$ to prostitute, practice prostitution or sexual immorality generally, but also used figuratively to denote the practice of idolatry.
- So the kings of the earth spiritually fornicate with her.
- They unite with her. They become one with her.
- They sell themselves out to her.
- They become "putty" in her hands.

Rev 2:1-7

1 "To the angel of the church in Ephesus write:

The One who holds the seven stars in His right hand, the One who walks among the seven golden lampstands, says this:

- 2 'I know your deeds and your toil and perseverance, and that you cannot tolerate evil men, and you put to the test those who call themselves apostles, and they are not, and you found them to be false;
- 3 and you have perseverance and have endured for My name's sake, and have not grown weary.
- 4 'But I have this against you, that you have left your first love.
- 5 'Therefore remember from where you have fallen, and repent and do the deeds you did at first; or else I am coming to you and will remove your lampstand out of its place — unless you repent.
- 6 'Yet this you do have, that you hate the deeds of the Nicolaitans, which I also hate.
- 7 'He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches. To him who overcomes, I will grant to eat of the tree of life which is in the Paradise of God.'

The Greek word for angels is αγγελοσ. It is not only used for heavenly angels, but also used for human messengers, such as John the Baptist (Matthew 11:10,Mark 1:2,Luke 7:27)

Matt 11:10

10 "This is the one about whom it is written,

'BEHOLD, I SEND MY **MESSENGER** AHEAD OF YOU,

WHO WILL PREPARE YOUR WAY BEFORE YOU.'

- "abominations" $\beta \delta \epsilon \lambda \upsilon \gamma \mu \alpha$ bdelugma -- something so vile that when it is brought before God it arouses his wrath. It includes all forms of idolatry - anything that distracts from the worship of God.
- "unclean things" ακαθαρτον akatharton refers to filth. That which pollutes the mind and soul. It refers to the ideas, doctrines, philosophies of man-made religion.


Rev 6:12-14

- 12 I looked when He broke the sixth seal, and there was a great earthquake; and the sun became black as sackcloth made of hair, and the whole moon became like blood;
- 13 and the stars of the sky fell to the earth, as a fig tree casts its unripe figs when shaken by a great wind.
- 14 The sky was split apart like a scroll when it is rolled up, and every mountain and island were moved out of their places.

αποχωριζω from απο which means "from," showing source, separation, departure," plus χωριζω which means "to separate, divide."

This compound verb means to tear apart, split or separate as when a huge curtain is separated or pulled back to reveal what lies behind it as in a theater.

The Sixth Seal: Revelation 6:14a Then the sky was divided like a torn scroll curling up.



Was divided: Literally, "was split," like a papyrus roll torn in two, each half then curling up to on either side.

"Studying the history of a particular setting in the Bible - a nation, race, country, kingdom, city, etc."

Smyrna -

- Had a history of dying as a city but coming back to life.
- Population: 200,000.
- Very wealthy city.
- Emperor worship.
- Loyalty to Rome.
- Large Jewish population.

Iranaeus (130-202 AD) who wrote in the second century said that, "John wrote a revelation the 14th year of the Roman Emperor Domitian who ruled from 81 to 96 A.D.,"





<u>Paul</u>

Acts 20:31

31 "Therefore be on the alert, remembering that night and day for a period of three years I did not cease to admonish each one with tears.

Aquila & Priscilla

Acts 18:18-19

- 18 Paul, having remained many days longer, took leave of the brethren and put out to sea for Syria, and with him were Priscilla and Aquila. In Cenchrea he had his hair cut, for he was keeping a vow.
- 19 They came to Ephesus, and he left them there.

<u>Apollos</u>

Acts 18:24,25

- 24 Now a Jew named Apollos, an Alexandrian by birth, an eloquent man, came to Ephesus; and he was mighty in the Scriptures.

<u>John</u>

John wrote his gospel and 1,2,3 John from Ephesus.

"They repented for awhile but then were lost . . ." - Ignatius 2nd century

The light of the church at Ephesus had not just been dimmed, but completely snuffed out.

Rev 3:14-22

- 14 "To the angel of the church in Laodicea write:
- The Amen, the faithful and true Witness, the Beginning of the creation of God, says this:
- 15 'I know your deeds, that you are neither cold nor hot; I wish that you were cold or hot.
- 16 'So because you are lukewarm, and neither hot nor cold, I will spit you out of My mouth.
- 17 'Because you say, "I am rich, and have become wealthy, and have need of nothing," and you do not know that you are wretched and miserable and poor and blind and naked,
- 18 I advise you to buy from Me gold refined by fire so that you may become rich, and white garments so that you may clothe yourself, and that the shame of your nakedness will not be revealed; and eye salve to anoint your eyes so that you may see.
- 19 'Those whom I love, I reprove and discipline; therefore be zealous and repent.
- 20 'Behold, I stand at the door and knock; if anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and will dine with him, and he with Me.
- 21 'He who overcomes, I will grant to him to sit down with Me on My throne, as I also overcame and sat down with My Father on His throne.
- 22 'He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches.'"

City of Laodicea

- 1. Founded in 261-253 BC by Antiochus II and named after his wife Laodice.
- 2. Laodicea means "people ruling."
- 3. It was the richest city of the 7 cities and maybe in the world at that time.
- 4. It had many buildings including a stadium, baths, temples, a gymnasium, theatres, and Senate House.
- 5. Laodicea became one of the most important and flourishing commercial centers of Asia Minor.
- <u>Center of Finance</u>

Banking - large money transactions.

• <u>Center of Garment Manufacturing</u>

Known for black wool – used for garments and carpets. Fashion center.



• <u>Center of Medicine</u>

Produced an eye salve for those with eye problems.

- 6. The city had become very independent and self-sufficient. When leveled by an earthquake in 60 AD, they refused any help or money from the emperor, Nero, to rebuild. They financed it all themselves.
- 7. The one major draw back of the city was its lack of a fresh water supply. Lycus River was too dirty. Streams too small, filled with impurities, gases and chemicals and many dried up during the winter.
- 8. Water had to be brought in in underground aqueducts from many miles away. The pipes would often become corroded with calcium carbonate. Hieropolis had hot springs where many came for healing, and Colossae had cold refreshing water for drinking. However as the water flowed through the pipes from either direction it became lukewarm and was filled with calcium carbonate and would make the people sick to the point of vomiting.


Aqueduct

The water that was piped to Laodicea was rich with calcium which over time would cause the pipes to clog. The engineers designed the aqueduct with vents covered with stones that could be removed periodically for cleaning.











History of ancient Babylon.

- $B\alpha\beta\nu\lambda\sigma\nu$ Babylon is the Greek word.
- הַכָּלָ Bab-el is the Hebrew word.
- Founded by Nimrod (2,300 B.C.) "to rebel".
- Babel represented rebellion against God.
- All idols of the world originate from Babylon.
- All false religious systems originate from Babylon.
- Nebuchadnezzar built the city for his glory (600 B.C.) -

Dan 4:30

- 30 "The king reflected and said, 'Is this not Babylon the great, which I myself have built as a royal residence by the might of my power and for the glory of my majesty?'
- Like "Hollywood" the name represents the world system as well as being the name of a particular city.

1 Peter 5:12-13

- 12 Through Silvanus, our faithful brother (for so I regard him), I have written to you briefly, exhorting and testifying that this is the true grace of God. Stand firm in it!
- 13 She who is in Babylon, chosen together with you, sends you greetings, and so does my son, Mark.
- Babylon is the fountainhead for all idolatry and pagan religious systems.

10 Horns – 10 future nations that will form the Roman Confederacy controlled by the Antichrist.

7 Heads – 7 nations. 6 are in the past. 1 is yet future.

*So the harlot Babylon has not only lined herself up with the kings of the earth and those who dwell on the earth, but also has an alliance with the Antichrist himself.



- On Independence Day 2017 Israel's population stood at 8,680,000. This is a 10-fold increase compared to when Israel was founded in 1948.
- The Jewish population makes up 6,484,000 (74.7%); 1,808,000 (20.8%) are Arabs; and, those identified as "others" (non-Arab Christians, Baha'i, etc) make up 4.5% of the population (388,000 people). When the state was established, there were only 806,000 residents and the total population reached its first and second millions in 1949 and 1958 respectively. Judging by current population trend data, experts predict that the population of Israel will reach 10 million by 2025 or sooner.
- Out of the 14.3 million Jewish people in the world, 43% reside in Israel.
- Of Israeli Jews, 44% self-identify as Secular, 11% simply as religious, and 9% as Ultra-Orthodox, 36% as other.

- 7. Israel's position in the world today:
- They are still partially and temporarily set aside.
- Many have returned back to the land of Israel.
- They are returning in unbelief.
- Israel, as a nation, in the Church age will remain in their current position until the 144,000 complete their evangelism campaign.
- Jews can be reconciled to God through their Messiah, Jesus Christ and be joined to the Church, the body of Christ. There is no dual-covenant.
- 2/3 of Israel will be wiped out by God in the Tribulation. (Zech 13:8,9)
- The next great event for spiritual Israel is the saving & sealing of the 144,000 which will lead to the salvation of the whole nation that are left at the end of the Tribulation.

*Pharaoh tried to drown the children of Israel and they would not drown. Nebuchadnezzar tried to burn them and they would not burn. Haman tried to hang them and they would not hang. Israel is here to stay!
