


Scripture is God's truth.


- It is God's truth whether you understand it or not
- It is God's truth whether you've experienced it or not.
- It is God's truth whether you have lived or not.
- The truth is not dependent on you or anyone else.
- Scripture is the same for everyone and its interpretation is the same for everyone.
- What the Bible means to you and what you think the truth is, is irrelevant to its truthfulness.
- The Bible is true whether it affects anyone or not.
- Scripture has 1 true meaning and that 1 true meaning is determined by God.
- God revealed all of His truth in 1 book and only 1 book.
- Our task then is to determine what God meant by what He has revealed in that 1 book.

How did we interpret the Book of Revelation?

United States Constitution. Article II Section 4..

"The President, Vice President and all civil Officers of the United States, shall be removed from Office on Impeachment on Impeachment for, and Conviction of, Treason, Bribery, or other high Crimes and Misdemeanors."






















1. Probe:

Find out why they are saying this.


- 95 % of the time it is only used as a smoke screen:
 - ✓ They may be a postmodernist and doesn't believe there is such a thing as absolute truth, so no interpretation will satisfy them.
 - √ "My mind may be made up, so don't confuse me with the facts."
 - ✓ They just plain does not want to face what the Bible says.
 - ✓ Realize that that statement is an incomplete claim or thought.
 - ✓ It is only used to shut you down, to end what you are saying so that it does not go on any longer.
 - ✓ The question is not designed to offer a superior or betterwarranted interpretation, but to relativize all interpretations.

"I'm curious, tell me what you mean by that."

2. Respond

"If I may say so, that is not just my interpretation. There are many other very serious students of the Bible who have come to the same interpretation."

"So, I'm curious, how do you know my interpretation is wrong?"


