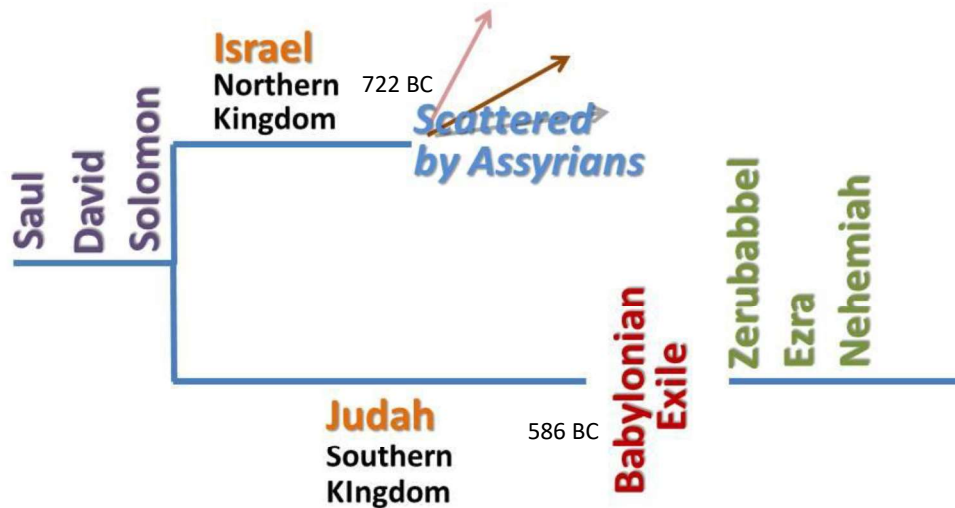

- This shocked the world.
- Jerusalem looked invincible.
 - strongly fortified with mountains and hills, with walls and bulwarks.
 - vast number of people in it.
 - it was the city of the great God, who had so often preserved and saved it.
- There is no earthly kingdom that is safe from external or internal destruction.
- God is our security.

"Jerusalem's fall in 586 B.C. exposed their false assurance and illustrates a theological truth of Scripture: Sinful and rebellious people, even if outwardly associated with the covenant community and the promises of God, should not presume on His protection."

**13 Because of the sins of her prophets

Who have shed in her midst
The blood of the righteous;**

- Jerusalem's leadership, which were the prophets and priests, failed the people of Israel.
- These two groups were supposed to preserve the spiritual well-being of Israel.
 - Prophets proclaimed God's word and interpreted His law.
 - Priests offered sacrifices for sin. Priests read and taught God's Word. The high priest alone was allowed to enter the Holy of Holies on the annual Day of Atonement.

7 "For the lips of a priest should preserve knowledge, and men should seek instruction from his mouth; for he is the messenger of the Lord of hosts.

Ezra 7:10 - Ezra – a faithful priest.

10 For Ezra had set his heart to study the law of the Lord and to practice it, and to teach His statutes and ordinances in Israel.

Neh 8:1-8

- 1 And all the people gathered as one man at the square which was in front of the Water Gate, and they asked Ezra the scribe to **bring the book** of the law of Moses which the Lord had given to Israel.
- 2 Then **Ezra the priest** brought the law before the assembly of men, women and all who could listen with understanding, on the first day of the seventh month.
- 3 He read from it before the square which was in front of the Water Gate from **early morning until midday**, in the presence of men and women, those who could understand; and **all the people were attentive** to the book of the law.
- 4 Ezra the scribe stood at a wooden podium which they had made for the purpose. . .
- 5 Ezra opened the book in the sight of all the people for he was standing above all the people; and when he opened it, **all the people stood up**.
- 6 Then Ezra blessed the Lord the great God. And all the people answered, "Amen, Amen!" while lifting up their hands; then they bowed low and worshiped the Lord with their faces to the ground.
- 7 . . . **the Levites explained the law** to the people while the people remained in their place.
- 8 They read from the book, from the law of God, **translating** (פָּרַשׁ *parash* - clearly declaring) **to give the sense** (שֵׂקֵל *sekel* - meaning, understanding) **so that they understood the reading**.

- The prophets and priests did not know where to walk. They acted as though they were blind as they tried to stagger around the dead bodies.
- Dead bodies with blood were all over the streets.
- Touching the blood of the dead with their garments defiled them.
- What a reversal: Instead of warning people of someone who had leprosy, they instead were saying, "Depart! Unclean!" they now had to say that about themselves. How humiliating.
- Other nations said, "We don't want them". Total rejection.

- The prophets and priests could not save Israel so now Israel turns to another nation.
- They looked for help, but it was useless.
- The reality was that no nation is going to save Israel.
- What are we trusting will save us?

- The residents of Jerusalem could not even walk the streets of their city because the danger was so great during the siege.
- After the walls were breached, they knew that their end was near.
- Zedekiah, the king, was of no help either. He was captured in a pit.
- There is no safety in prophets, priests, nations, or kings.

- It is always easier to trust in a political alliance than to trust in the Lord.
- It is always easier to trust in a king or president than to trust in the Lord.
- But they are false hopes.

- The cup of God's wrath will pass from Israel to Edom.
- They will stagger to and fro and fall as though drunk from the effects of the wrath of God.
- They will be stripped of their riches and wealth.
- It will start in less than 100 years and will end in 125 B.C.

- Israel's punishment will end and Edom's will begin (5th century). Book of Obadiah.
- Edom will be laid bare. Her sins exposed.
- Edom does not receive mercy and forgiveness. Israel does.
- Every person, regardless of anyone else, will give an account for there sin.

On the Day of Judgment will you receive mercy and
forgiveness or wrath and condemnation?
