3 callings in scripture:

1. The call of salvation to the unbeliever.

General call.

Matt 22:14

14 "For many are **called**, but few are chosen." *Effectual call*.

1 Peter 2:9

9 But you are A CHOSEN RACE, A royal PRIESTHOOD, A HOLY NATION, A PEOPLE FOR God's OWN POSSESSION, so that you may proclaim the excellencies of Him who has called you out of darkness into His marvelous light;

"Twelve" - why 12?

- 12 tribes in Israel. The Church temporarily is replacing Israel. This is an indictment on Israel.
- · Simon and Andrew
- Thomas and Matthew (tax collector)
- · James and John
- James and Thaddaeus
- Philip and Andrew
- · Simon the Zealot and Judas Iscariot
- Jesus calls the disciples and grants them 2 different spiritual abilities:
 - Power and authority over all demons (regardless of rank).
 - 2. Power and authority to heal diseases.

Matt 10:5-8

5 These twelve Jesus sent out after instructing them: "Do not go in the way of the Gentiles, and do not enter any city of the Samaritans;

6 but rather go to the lost sheep of the house of Israel.

7 "And as you go, preach, saying, 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.'

8 "Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out demons.

2 And He sent them out to proclaim the kingdom of God and to perform healing.

• All abilities and gifts were given to authenticate their reason for being sent out = to proclaim the kingdom of God.

Heb 2:3-4

3 how will we escape if we neglect so great a salvation? After it was at the first spoken through the Lord, it was confirmed to us by those who heard,

4 God also testifying with them, both by signs and wonders and by various miracles and by gifts of the Holy Spirit according to His own will.

2 Cor 12:12

12 The signs of a true apostle were performed among you with all perseverance, by signs and wonders and miracles.

"proclaim the kingdom of God" -


The message was:

- The King has arrived; Jesus the Messiah is present with us.
- His kingdom is different from what we expected.
- He gathers a kingdom community of those who will repent and believe.

2 And He sent them out to proclaim the kingdom of God and to perform healing.

- **Note:** They were not to preach morality. Nor were they to engage in politics or try to reform government. Only proclaim repentance and belief.
- They were to proclaim whenever and wherever they could synagogues, streetcorners, public squares, gates of the city, houses, marketplace, personal conversations.

• Jesus tells them what not to take with them:

No staff – used for protection, authority, something to lean on.

No bag – for clothes and food.

No bread – for food

No money – to make purchases

No extra tunic – cloak or outer garment.

Note: They were to be supported by those to whom they ministered

Luke 22:35-36

35 And He said to them, "When I sent you out without money belt and bag and sandals, you did not lack anything, did you?" They said, "No, nothing."

36 And He said to them, "But now, whoever has a money belt is to take it along, likewise also a bag, and whoever has no sword is to sell his coat and buy one.

4 "Whatever house you enter, stay there until you leave that city.

- There were no hotels.
- Minister to people and someone will invite you in.
- Moving from house to house would imply that they were seeking better place to stay, and this would insult those they were staying with.

Phil 4:12-13

12 I know how to get along with humble means, and I also know how to live in prosperity; in any and every circumstance I have learned the secret of being filled and going hungry, both of having abundance and suffering need.

13 I can do all things through Him who strengthens me.

"shake the dust off your feet" – this was a symbol, done when a Jew went into Gentile territory and then when he left, when he crossed the border, he shook the dust off of his feet, his clothes. everything.

Treat them as unclean pagans.

Matt 10:14-15

14 "Whoever does not receive you, nor heed your words, as you go out of that house or that city, shake the dust off your feet.

15 "Truly I say to you, it will be more tolerable for the land of Sodom and Gomorrah in the day of judgment than for that city.

- If they reject your message, you reject them.
- Why is that important? Because those who reject Christ need to know that they are under condemnation.







In marrying Herodias,

Herod at once married a woman both his niece and his sister-in-law.

- He is freaking out because he can't figure out who Jesus is and he is getting a little paranoid.
- Was Jesus -
 - **1. John the Baptist** who came back from the dead to haunt and possibly kill Herod? (7)

2. Elijah?

Mal 4:5

5 "Behold, I am going to send you Elijah the prophet before the coming of the great and terrible day of the Lord.

Matt 17:10-13

10 And His disciples asked Him, "Why then do the scribes say that Elijah must come first?"

11 And He answered and said, "Elijah is coming and will restore all things;

12 but I say to you that Elijah already came, and they did not recognize him, but did to him whatever they wished. So also the Son of Man is going to suffer at their hands."

13 Then the disciples understood that He had spoken to them about John the Baptist.

3. A prophet that had risen from the dead?

Jeremiah or ???

• If you can heal people, you will have a following.

34 When Jesus went ashore, He saw a large crowd, and He felt compassion for them because they were like sheep without a shepherd; and He began to teach them many things.

- For some, that is all they wanted to be healed.
- But the healings gave Jesus an opportunity to tell them of the kingdom of God.
- When you have the attention of people (Thanksgiving, Christmas, Easter, etc.) use it to share the gospel.
- So the preaching and the healing go together.

Remember -

Better to be lame when you enter heaven,

than healed and end-up in hell.

Better to be blind when you enter heaven,

than healed and end-up in hell.

Better to be deaf when you enter heaven,

than healed and end-up in hell.

Better to be diseased when you enter heaven, than healed and end-up in hell.

• Today we don't heal, but we do have the completed, powerful, Word of God to share with people.

Rom 1:16

16 For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes,

Heb 4:12

12 For the word of God is living and active and sharper than any two-edged sword, and piercing as far as the division of soul and spirit, of both joints and marrow, and able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart.

Application

1. When you are called by God, God will provide all that you will need to accomplish and fulfill the call.

1 Thess 5:24

24 Faithful is He who calls you, and He also will bring it to pass.

- 2. Keep the task of sharing the gospel simple.
- 3. Make sure your evangelism covers both the benefits of the reception of the gospel and the consequences for the rejection of the gospel.
- 4. Opposition will be the most fierce when you threaten the kingdom of darkness.
