- 6 "woes" 3 this week and 3 next week.
- "Woe" you are in grave danger. A pronouncement of judgement.

1st "Woe": You are obsessed with minutia.

2nd "Woe": You love attention.

3rd "Woe": You defile others by your influence.

- 45 One of the lawyers said to Him in reply, "Teacher, when You say this, You insult us too."

- "lawyers" = scribes (vs. 53)
- They were the architects of the entire Pharisaical system. They wrote all of the laws, rules, and regulations. They were the ones who interpreted the 613.
- They created a complex system of interpretations that included allegories, mystical definitions, and secret meanings.
- That is how religion controls people "You can't interpret the Scriptures, or the sacred books, only the leaders can. Follow us and our teachings and we will lead you into truth."
- To oppose their interpretation and application was heresy, and in Jesus' case because He blew up the system, was worthy of death.
- "insult" $\upsilon\beta\rho\iota\zeta\omega$ to offend, to shame, to bring reproach.
- "No one ever talked to us this way. Where is your respect?"
- Jesus is an "equal opportunity offender."

4th "Woe": Your requirements are hypocritical.

- The lawyers designed the system.
- It was nearly an impossible system to live.
- But they didn't themselves follow their own system.
- "touch" $\pi\rho\sigma\sigma\psi\alpha\upsilon\omega$ to move your finger over something, to impinge.
- "You won't lift your little finger to do what you require of others."
- They found loopholes.

Sabbath was a hard day for Israel under Pharisaicalism -

- On the Sabbath, a man could not carry something in his right hand or in his left hand, across his chest or on his shoulder. But you could carry something with the back of your hand, with your foot, with your elbow, or in your ear, your hair, or in the hem of your shirt, or in your shoe or sandal.
- On the Sabbath it was forbidden to tie a knot except, a woman could tie a knot in her girdle. So, if a bucket of water had to be raised from a well, you could not tie a rope to the bucket, but a woman could tie her girdle to the bucket and raise it from the well.

- 1 Now it happened that He was passing through some grainfields on a Sabbath; and His disciples were picking the heads of grain, rubbing them in their hands, and eating the grain.
- 2 But some of the Pharisees said, "Why do you do what is not lawful on the Sabbath?"

Luke 6:6-11

- 6 On another Sabbath He entered the synagogue and was teaching; and there was a man there whose right hand was withered.
- 7 The scribes and the Pharisees were watching Him closely to see if He healed on the Sabbath, so that they might find reason to accuse Him.
- 8 But He knew what they were thinking, and He said to the man with the withered hand, "Get up and come forward!" And he got up and came forward.

- 16 For this reason the Jews were persecuting Jesus, because He was doing these things on the Sabbath.

- They are pretenders. They want people to think that they are not like their ancestors that killed the OT prophets (Neh. 9:26; Jer. 2:30.)
- "We are better. Look what we are doing."

- Follow the line of reasoning Jesus is exposing here
 - 1. Your fathers killed the prophets.
 - 2. You're restoring the tombs of the prophets.
 - 3. You are therefore looking good on the outside by building the prophets tombs, but on the inside you have the same wicked hearts as your fathers.
 - 4. You do not condemn them.
 - 5. You are plotting to kill the greatest of all prophets.
- Note: "The acorn does not fall far from the tree."

- "prophets and apostles" were leaders in the first century church.
- They killed John the Baptist, Jesus, Stephen, James. Peter, and the other apostles.
- "You are no different from your fathers."
- It is hypocrisy to think otherwise.

- So this has all been piling up since the beginning of time and it is the first century Jews that are going to be charged with it.
- The Jews are responsible for all of the past generations and what they did because they did not condemn it. They are being charged with the murders of all of the prophets. They had the knowledge of what happened in the past and their wicked hearts are approving it all over again by plotting to kill Jesus.

Rom 9:3-5

- 3 For I could wish that I myself were accursed, separated from Christ for the sake of my brethren, my kinsmen according to the flesh,
- 4 who are Israelites, to whom belongs the adoption as sons, and the glory and the covenants and the giving of the Law and the temple service and the promises,

- The blood-shedding extends from A Z.
- Abel (Gen. 4) to Zechariah (Zech. 1:1; 2 Chron 24:20-22)
- The first century generation will be judged with it all.
- You are responsible for the light given to you.

3 things they have done:

- 1. You have taken away the key that unlocks the knowledge of the Scriptures which gives us the truth.
- 2. It has prevented you from entering.
- 3. You keep others from entering.
- That is the danger of religion. It will imprison you and will damn you and others faster than anything else.

- "very hostile" $\delta \epsilon i \nu \omega \sigma$ vehemently, excessively
- So they turn the heat up.
- Their strategy: Question Jesus closely. Cover a lot of subjects. He is bound to slip up.

- They will have a plan, a scheme, a plot.
- They will "hunt" (plotting) Him down.
- They want to get Him to say something that will incriminate Him: 1. according to the Law. 2. morally. 3. by blaspheming.
- How is your speech? Could you be caught by someone observing your life?

Luke 6:11

11 But they themselves were filled with rage, and discussed together what they might do to Jesus.

Luke 19:47

47 And He was teaching daily in the temple; but the chief priests and the scribes and the leading men among the people were trying to destroy Him,

Luke 20:19,20

- 19 The scribes and the chief priests tried to lay hands on Him that very hour, and they feared the people; for they understood that He spoke this parable against them.
- 20 So they watched Him, and sent spies who pretended to be righteous, in order that they might catch Him in some statement, so that they could deliver Him to the rule and the authority of the governor.

Luke 22:2

2 The chief priests and the scribes were seeking how they might put Him to death; for they were afraid of the people.

Application

- The gospel is offensive. The gospel offends the proud heart of man and requires humility if it is to be received.
- 2. Is your Christian life marked by complexity because legalism has crept in and turned your life into a bunch of "do's" and "don'ts?"
- 3. Do we require of others, things that we don't even do?
- 4. Religion is a powerful force in the lives of billions of people. Be prepared with what you would say to those who are imprisoned by it.
