"Infants and Idols"

Luke 18:15-30

October 29, 2023

15 And they were bringing even their babies to Him so that He would touch them, but when the disciples saw it, they began rebuking them.

βρεφος - an infant, a baby. Usually under 3.

- It was not unusual for parents to bring their infants to a rabbi to be blessed.
- Besides that, people were always coming to Jesus, or were brought to Jesus.
- But the disciples saw this as an intrusion – "Jesus is just too busy! More important things to do."
- **Note:** There is no infant baptism performed here. This would have been a good time if it existed. Only a touch was needed. Infant baptism has not biblical basis. Zero. It is not based on OT circumcision and it cannot be proven to be in the baptisms in the book of Acts, which were all done **after** people put their faith in Christ as Savior.

“If there were any place in the Bible where we might expect to find some mention or example of “infant sprinkling” this would be the place; but that is not the case. This practice of what is called “infant baptism” is totally without foundation in Holy Scripture. There is not so much as one word in the Bible that teaches, or even implies it. And there is not a single example of it in the entire Bible. It is a practice purely of Roman Catholic origin.”

16 But Jesus called for them, saying, "Permit the children to come to Me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these.

- Jesus loved children and children loved Jesus.
- Jesus then makes an incredible statement – “the Kingdom of God belongs to them.”
- What other group could you say that about?
- Infants, therefore, who have not yet reached a “condition of accountability” where they understand their sinfulness, what Jesus did on the cross to forgive their sin, and the ability to make a choice to repent and believe, they are covered by the grace of God.
- Therefore that means:
 1. If they should die, they will go straight to heaven.
 2. They do not go to limbo or some other waiting place. Zero scripture.
 3. All infants who die are elect.

- Bottom line: If you don't become like a child, you can't enter the Kingdom of God.

What does that mean?

1. Infants have **nothing** to offer for anything. They have no status. They can perform no works. They are totally dependent on someone else providing for them.
2. You don't enter the Kingdom of God by who you are or what you have done.
3. You enter the Kingdom of God by who God is and what He has done.
4. Infants are the perfect model by the way you enter the Kingdom – totally by the work of another, by grace alone.
5. If you try to come a different way, than that of an infant, you cannot enter. So you come, humbly, and with empty hands to receive the Kingdom.

18 A ruler questioned Him, saying, "Good Teacher, what shall I do to inherit eternal life?"

- This guy is rich (18:23), young (Matt. 19:20), ruler (18:18)
- He is a leader in the synagogue, he is looked up to, seen as spiritual, religious, keeper of the Law.
- "runs" up to Jesus (Mark 10:17). He was eager to find something out.
- "**Good**" - "There is no instance in the whole Talmud of a rabbi being addressed as 'Good Master'" (Plummer). They insisted on calling God alone "good."
- Therefore if you call someone "good", you are saying they are God.
- He asks the question of the ages.
- If you do evangelism, this is a dream question.

- Do you understand what you are saying?
- God alone is good. You call me good. I am God. He got this right.
- This 1st century Yuppie wanted a list. Jesus gives him one.
- Jesus takes him right to the Law – 10 commandments.

Gal 3:24

24 Therefore the Law has become our tutor to lead us to Christ, so that we may be justified by faith.

- Let's see how you do?
- The Law will expose your sinfulness.
- All commandments Jesus gives come from the last 6 of the 10.

21 And he said, "All these things I have kept from my youth."

22 When Jesus heard this, He said to him, "One thing you still lack; sell all that you possess and distribute it to the poor, and you shall have treasure in heaven; and come, follow Me."

- You have kept them – really? You either don't know what the commandments mean, or you don't know yourself.
- Same thinking Paul had.

Phil 3:6

6 to the righteousness which is in the Law, found blameless.

1 John 1:8

If we say that we have no sin, we are deceiving ourselves and the truth is not in us.

- If he has kept them, then why the question about eternal life? He was self-deceived. No security of salvation.
- Now Jesus goes right to the guy's heart – his money and possessions.
- He was an idolater.
- So Jesus asks him to give it all up and follow Him. Become like an infant.
- Can't serve 2 masters – God and money.
- "Sell, Give, Come, Follow."
- You have to get beyond the trinkets of this world.
- So in actuality this young man had broken the first 2 commandments.

Ex 20:3-4

3 "You shall have no other gods before Me.

4 "You shall not make for yourself an idol,

“It’s true, isn’t it, that money can choke out the things of God? There are a great many Christians who love Jesus when they make fifteen thousand dollars a year. Fewer who love him when they make thirty thousand. Fewer still who love him when they make fifty thousand. Fewer still who love him when they make one hundred and fifty thousand. Fewer yet who love him when they make half a million dollars a year. There are a great many Christians who would become deeply committed to Jesus Christ again, if only they would go broke. περιλυπος – intensely sad, grieved, exceedingly sorrowful.

σφοδρα – extremely, greatly, high degree.

- This guy had it all materially – “I’ve got my pension. I’ve got my stocks and bonds. I’ve got my 401k. I’ve got my options. I’ve got my golden parachute. I’ve got my safety net.”
- He was sad because he had to make a decision.
- He could not handle the idea of giving up what he had accumulated.
- We usually only think of poverty as being a problem. Jesus told us that riches may present an even more serious problem.

- Jesus looks him right in the eye.
- Jesus compares the difficulty to camels and needles. You are trying to get something that is just too large through a small opening. The camel needs to get trimmed down.

14 "For the gate is small and the way is narrow that leads to life, and there are few who find it.

- Why is it difficult for the wealthy? Because they can't get through the gate. Too much baggage. They don't want to leave it behind and enter. They are trusting in their baggage.

- Salvation does not depend on a spiritually dead person ability to breathe life into himself, to forsake his idolatry, and to follow Christ.
- Salvation is a work of God in the sinners life where he regenerates the individual to do the above. So yes, rich people can be saved.

20 "You know the commandments, 'DO NOT COMMIT ADULTERY, DO NOT MURDER, DO NOT STEAL, DO NOT BEAR FALSE WITNESS, HONOR YOUR FATHER AND MOTHER.'"

21 And he said, "All these things I have kept from my youth."

22 When Jesus heard this, He said to him, "One thing you still lack; sell all that you possess and distribute it to the poor, and you shall have treasure in heaven; and come, follow Me."

23 But when he had heard these things, he became very sad, for he was extremely rich.

24 And Jesus looked at him and said, "How hard it is for those who are wealthy to enter the kingdom of God!

Application

1. Infants provide an excellent model for us to understand that it is by God's grace alone that we are saved.
2. The Pharisee praying in the Temple, and the rich young ruler, display the prideful, idolatrous heart of man that refuses to bow in obedience to the Lordship of Christ.
3. Self deception is the worst kind of deception.
4. Eternal life is a different quality of life obtained in salvation, and experienced throughout all eternity.
5. Never think that what you sacrifice here, will not be rewarded in eternity.
