

Luke 19:28-40

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• We now begin the final week before the crucifixion.

• Jesus has reached the final destination of His ministry here on earth. – Jerusalem.

• It will be here that He will die on the cross for the sins of mankind.

• It is a journey that began some 3 years ago . . .

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

• Jesus travels to 2 small villages.

• The one, Bethany, will be His headquarters for the next week.

• It is the home of Mary, Martha, and Lazarus.

• Let's trace on a map what is going to happen in this passage . . .





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- We will see here that Jesus is in total control of the situation. As always, the sovereignty of God prevails over every situation.

- Jesus will sovereignly control:

1. The timing – A. fulfills Dan. 9:24-27.

Dan 9:24-27

24 "Seventy weeks have been decreed for your people and your holy city, to finish the transgression, to make an end of sin, to make atonement for iniquity, to bring in everlasting righteousness, to seal up vision and prophecy and to anoint the most holy place.

25 "So you are to know and discern that from the issuing of a decree to restore and rebuild Jerusalem until Messiah the Prince there will be seven weeks and sixty-two weeks; it will be built again, with plaza and moat, even in times of distress.

26 "Then after the sixty-two weeks the Messiah will be cut off and have nothing, and the people of the prince who is to come will destroy the city and the sanctuary. And its end will come with a flood; even to the end there will be war, desolation are determined.

27 "And he will make a firm covenant with the many for one week, but in the middle of the week he will put a stop to sacrifice and grain offering, and on the wing of abominations will come one who makes desolate, even until a complete destruction, one that is decreed, is poured out on the one who makes desolate."


Daniel 9:24-27

Antichrist signs covenant with Israel.

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- We will see here that Jesus is in total control of the situation. As always, the sovereignty of God prevails over every situation.

• Jesus will choose:

1. The timing – A. Fulfills Dan. 9:24-27. B. Fulfills Christ dying on Friday, Passover. Jesus being our sacrificial Lamb will die on the Friday when thousands of sacrificial lambs would be sacrificed.

John 12:1

12. Jesus, therefore, **six days** before the Passover, came to Bethany where Lazarus was, whom Jesus had raised from the dead.

2. The place – Eastern Gate - Jerusalem.

3. The entrance – rides in on a donkey.

4. The response – Israel and the Pharisees.

• It begins with His sending on ahead 2 of His disciples.

Luke 19:28-40

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31 "If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' you shall say, 'The Lord has need of it.'"

32 So those who were sent went away and found it just as He had told them.

33 As they were untying the colt, its owners said to them,

"Why are you untying the colt?"

34 They said, "The Lord has need of it."

35 They brought it to Jesus, and they threw their coats on the colt and put Jesus on it.

• Note the 2 attributes of Jesus being displayed here: 1. Omnipotence – the knowledge of the colt. 2. Omnipotence – the power which guarantees the colt will be used.

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38 shouting:

"BLESSED IS THE KING WHO COMES IN THE NAME OF THE LORD;

Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!"

• The spreading of the coats on the road was a sign of submission.

• Once they come over the peak of the Mt. of Olives, they erupt in praise.

• They knew the miracles He had performed.

• Many of those who were touched by Jesus were no doubt in the crowd – beggars, son's, daughters, Lazarus, Zach, etc.

• Perhaps over 200,000 coming down the mountain inside.

• They were saying, "This is it!" "The Kingdom will be built!"

"Rome will be defeated!" "We will be set free!" "He can do it!"

"He is the King!"

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* Prophecy was given 500 years earlier.

• Note the word "humble."

• A Roman Triumph –

- A big parade.

• Roman general led the parade on a large white stallion.

- Followed by his "trophies" – kings and soldiers captured, money and jewels taken and displayed, and then his own army to follow.

Mark 11:8-10

8 And many spread their coats in the road, and others spread leafy branches which they had cut from the fields.

9 Those who went in front and those who followed were shouting:

"Hosanna!

BLESSED IS HE WHO COMES IN THE NAME OF THE LORD;

10 Blessed is the coming kingdom of our father David;

Hosanna in the highest!"

Is. 9:6-7

6 For a child will be born to us, a son will be given to us;


And the government will rest on His shoulders;

And His name will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God,

Eternal Father, Prince of Peace.

7 There will be no end to the increase of His government or of peace,
On the throne of David and over his kingdom,
To establish it and to uphold it with justice and righteousness
From then on and forevermore.

The zeal of the Lord of hosts will accomplish this.



- The gate was sealed by Islamic leaders to prevent a future Messiah from entering.

- A cemetery was also built in front of the gate to prevent the Messiah from coming in. He would be declared unclean if He would pass through the graveyard.

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40 But Jesus answered, "I tell you, if these become silent, the stones will cry out!"

- This is just too much for the Pharisees.

The crowd is praising Jesus as the Messiah.

- The crowd is ascribing to Jesus what Jesus does not deserve and to the Pharisees, that's blasphemy.

The Pharisees want it to stop, but they have no control. How then can they expect Jesus to stop maybe 200,000 screaming people?

- But Jesus condemns the Pharisees for what they want – for the people to keep quiet.

If people don't do it, then the rocks will.

Note: The whole design of the universe is that Christ be praised.

- The gift of the Father to the Son is a redeemed people who will spend eternity in worship and praise.

• Israel fell silent in a few days and has remained silent to this day.

• 40 years later judgment fell on Jerusalem.


Rom 11:25-26

25 ...that a partial hardening has happened to Israel until the fullness of the Gentiles has come in;

26 and so all Israel will be saved;

Zech 12:10

10 "I will pour out on the house of David and on the inhabitants of Jerusalem the Spirit of grace and of supplication, so that they will look on Me whom they have pierced; and they will mourn for Him, as one mourns for an only son, and they will weep bitterly over Him like the bitter weeping over a firstborn.



Application

1. God is always in control, not just the big picture, but the small details.

2. If the crowd is doing it, beware, it is probably wrong.

3. If you fall silent from praising and extolling the person of Christ, God will move on to someone else, or to even something like stones that get to experience the joy.
