- 46 "Beware of the scribes, who like to walk around in long robes, and love respectful greetings in the market places, and chief seats in the synagogues and places of honor at banquets.

• The disciples and Jesus now leave the temple and walk to the Mount of Olives where He will teach them the coming future judgment.

Matt 23:37-24:3

37 "Jerusalem, Jerusalem, who kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to her! How often I wanted to gather your children together, the way a hen gathers her chicks under her wings, and you were unwilling.

38 "Behold, your house is being left to you desolate)

39 "For I say to you, from now on you will not see Me until you say, 'BLESSED IS HE WHO COMES IN THE NAME OF THE LORD!'"

1 Jesus came out from the temple and was going away when His disciples came up to point out the temple buildings to Him.

2 And He said to them, "Do you not see all these things? Truly I say to you, not one stone here will be left upon another, which will not be torn down."

3 As He was sitting on the Mount of Olives, the disciples came to Him privately, saying, "Tell us, when will these things happen, and what will be the sign of Your coming, and of the end of the age?"

5 Jewish Temples in Scripture

- 5 And while some were talking about the temple, that it was adorned with beautiful stones and votive gifts, He said,
- Herod's temple was 50 years in the making: 20 B.C. 30 A.D.
- It was an incredible structure and an amazing construction project size, polished stones, architecture, colonnades.
- 18,000 workers. 1,000 of them were priests.
- Some limestone blocks were 40 feet long and 18 feet wide and weighed hundreds of tons. (1 stone could weigh 160,000 pounds)
- 1,000 oxen were used.
- "beautiful stones" Precious stones, brought by the people, were embedded every where in the building.
- Extensive use of gold. Reflect off of the temple.
- "votive gifts" people made a vow and then would give a gift golden plaques, all kinds of golden sculpture, golden tables, golden vines, etc., hung on pillars, set on perches or on the floor.




Date Built: 20 B.C. – 30 A.D.





Comprehensive Biblical View of Future Prophetic Events






Comprehensive Biblical View of Future Prophetic Events

• Men claiming to be the Messiah.

Matt 24:4,5

- 4 And Jesus answered and said to them, "See to it that no one misleads you.

Deception by false Christs.

- There have been false Christs before, but now the number has intensified and escalated.
- They are empowered by demons to do supernatural feats.
- The world begins to disintegrate.
- Suffering will be unbearable.
- Sin will reach its maximum potential.
- The Church is gone.
- The restraining influence of the Holy Spirit is gone.
- False Christ's will rise to the occasion bringing promises.
- People who claim they know the date.


Sign # 2: War

Matt 24:6

6 "You will be hearing of wars and rumors of wars. See that you are not frightened, for those things must take place, but that is not yet the end.

Rev 6:1-4

- 1 Then I saw when the Lamb broke one of the seven seals, and I heard one of the four living creatures saying as with a voice of thunder, "Come."
- 2 I looked, and behold, a white horse, and he who sat on it had a bow; and a crown was given to him, and he went out conquering and to conquer.
- 3 When He broke the second seal, I heard the second living creature saying, "Come."
- 4 And another, a red horse, went out; and to him who sat on it, it was granted to take peace from the earth, and that men would slay one another; and a great sword was given to him.
