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- 40 When He arrived at the place, He said to them, "Pray that you may not enter into temptation."
- 41 And He withdrew from them about a stone's throw, and He knelt down and began to pray,
- 42 saying, "Father, if You are willing, remove this cup from Me; yet not My will, but Yours be done."
- 43 Now an angel from heaven appeared to Him, strengthening Him.
- 44 And being in agony He was praying very fervently; and His sweat became like drops of blood, falling down upon the ground.
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- Upper room to the Garden of Gethsemane.
- "custom" used by Jesus and disciples numerous times.
- Many in Jerusalem had gardens on the western slope of the Mt. of Olives because space was limited in Jerusalem.
- May have been fenced or gated.
- No doubt owned by trusted believers (a man or family)
- Provided privacy, a place to get away.
- This is perhaps midnight or after.

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- What Jesus says here indicated that the disciples will be entering into a spiritual warfare that they had not known.
- Satan will be using every means possible to "blow this whole thing up."
- Temptation will come upon the disciples. They must be aware of that. They must refuse. They must stay strong.
- Scripture does not record specifically what temptation would befall them.

Matt 6:7

13 'And do not lead us into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

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The other gospels tell us: 8 were left maybe at the gate.
 Peter, James and John went a little further with Jesus, and now Jesus goes by Himself still further.

"stone's throw" - 30-40 feet.

- The customary position to pray was standing up.
- Other gospels say He laid flat on the ground.

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- At first glance, it appears this is a sign of weakness Jesus does not want to face the cross.
- But that is absolutely false!
- Here is what Jesus saw in the cup:
 - 1. **The sin of the world.** That sin would be placed on Him by the Father. All of the sins committed by everyone in the world over all of time would be placed on Him.
 - 2. **The wrath of God against that sin.** He would become the One who would bear the full wrath of an angry God.
 - 3. **Separation from the Father.** If the sin of the world is placed on Him, and He becomes sin, separation from the Father is inevitable. Very difficult for Jesus to think of the wrath of His own Father falling on Him.

2 Cor 5:21

21 He made Him who knew no sin to be sin on our behalf, so that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.

Why was Jesus wanting this cup removed? Because He is holy and righteous, unstained by sin. The thought of the weight of the sin of mankind placed upon Him, sin which Jesus hated to His core, was nearly too much to bear. "Is there another way?" This is how the holy, pure Son of God reacts to sin.

The Garden of Eden made necessary the Garden of Gethsemane.

- 42 saying, "Father, if You are willing, remove this cup from Me; yet not My will, but Yours be done."
- βουλομαι a determinative will. A plan. "If this is a part of your plan, remove this cup."

 θ ελημα – a wish, a desire.

Great example of how we should pray:

- 1. We are always submissive in our prayers to the greater plan and purposes of God.
- 2. It is right and proper to express our desires, emotions, inclinations to God.
- 3. My desires may not always fit in the determined plan of God. That's ok. Our goal is to glorify Him most fully in everything.

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- The Father dispatches an angel to provide strength for His Son.
- The struggle, the pain, the agony, the suffering was too much to bear. He is at the point of death.

Mark 14:34

34 And He said to them, "My soul is deeply grieved to the point of death;

- Jesus is praying with such passion, that His body begins to show the effects.
- The burden, the weight of the cup, to bear sin, wrath, and separation, has taken His body to the limit.
- "like drops of blood" . . .

"His sweat became like drops of blood - Like blood, but not blood, most likely because it was blood tinged. Hematidrosis is a rare medical condition where one's sweat will contain blood. The sweat glands are surrounded by tiny blood vessels which apparently can dilate to the point of rupture so that blood mixes the sweat."

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- Jesus was soaked in sweat and blood.
- We will never fully understand what Jesus experienced.
- He was near death.

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- In spite of what He had gone through, He still thought of His disciples and their spiritual condition.
- They were sleeping from sorrow.
- One of the clinical signs of depression is excessive sleeping.
- They were sad everything has fallen apart Judas, Peter, Jesus going to the cross. Where is the Kingdom? Where is the victory?

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- Jesus knows at this point that the battle is intense.
- It will be difficult for their faith not to fail.
- They need to resist.
- Satan will be putting all kinds of thoughts in their heads to defect.
- They need God's help in their time of depression.

Application

- 1. Do you live a surrendered life?
- 2. Coming in contact with sin is unavoidable, but does it bother you?
- 3. Depression, sorrow, sadness requires the power of God strengthening us through prayer to resist temptation.
