
6 components of the final scene at the cross:

Black=Our Time Red=Jewish Time






Brazen Altar- The Cross of Christ

Matt 27:46

46 About the ninth hour Jesus cried out with a loud voice, saying, "ELI, ELI, LAMA SABACTHANI?" that is, "MY GOD, MY GOD, WHY HAVE YOU FORSAKEN ME?"

• God the Father abandons the Son for a brief moment, as the Son became sin on our behalf.

John 19:30

30 Therefore when Jesus had received the sour wine, He said, "**It is finished!**" And He bowed His head and gave up His spirit.

- Everything in the old covenant was pointing to this event – the death of the Messiah, the Lamb of God. All of the sacrifices, all of the Feasts, all of the shadows, all of the symbols, pointed to Christ.

• Therefore all O.T. features that pointed to Christ were now fulfilled.

col 2:16-17

16 Therefore no one is to act as your judge in regard to food or drink or in respect to a festival or a new moon or a Sabbath day —

17 things which are a mere shadow of what is to come; but the substance belongs to Christ.

- There is nothing more that needs to be added to it – redemption is complete: no atonement, no suffering, no co-redemptrix, and no works.

• Jesus gives up His spirit. It is not taken away from Him.

• This fulfilled 2 O.T. prophecies . . .

John 19:31-37

31 Then the Jews, because it was the day of preparation, so that the bodies would not remain on the cross on the Sabbath (for that Sabbath was a high day), asked Pilate that their legs might be broken, and that they might be taken away.

32 So the soldiers came, and broke the legs of the first man and of the other who was crucified with Him,

33 but coming to Jesus, when they saw that He was already dead, they did not break His legs.
