Chronological Events of the 4 Gospels

- 1. Jesus is buried, as several women watch** (Matthew 27:57-61; Mark 15:42-47; Luke 23:50-56; John 19:38-42).
- 2. The tomb is sealed and a guard is set** (Matthew 27:62-66).
- 3. At least 3 women, including Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome, prepare spices to go to the tomb** (Matthew 28:1; Mark 16:1).
- 4. An angel descends from heaven, rolls the stone away, and sits on it. There is an earthquake, and the guards faint** (Matthew 28:2-4).
- 5. The women arrive at the tomb and find it empty. Mary Magdalene leaves the other women there and runs to tell the disciples** (John 20:1-2).
- 6. The women still at the tomb see two angels who tell them that Jesus is risen and who instruct them to tell the disciples to go to Galilee** (Matthew 28:5-7; Mark 16:2-8; Luke 24:1-8).
- 7. The women leave to bring the news to the disciples** (Matthew 28:8).
- 8. The guards, having roused themselves, report the empty tomb to the authorities, who bribe the guards to say the body was stolen** (Matthew 28:11-15).
- 9. Mary the mother of James and the other women, on their way to find the disciples, see Jesus** (Matthew 28:9-10).
- 10. The women relate what they have seen and heard to the disciples** (Luke 24:9-11).

- 11. Mary Magdalene returns to the tomb. She sees the angels, and then she sees Jesus (John 20:11-18).**
- 12. Later the same day, Jesus appears to Peter (Luke 24:34; 1 Corinthians 15:5).**
- 13. Still on the same day, Jesus appears to Cleopas and another disciple on their way to Emmaus (Luke 24:13-32).**
- 14. That evening, the two disciples report the event to the Eleven in Jerusalem (Luke 24:32-35).**
- 15. Jesus appears to ten disciples—Thomas is missing (Luke 24:36-43; John 20:19-25).**
- 16. Jesus appears to all eleven disciples—Thomas included (John 20:26-31).**
- 17. Jesus appears to seven disciples by the Sea of Galilee (John 21:1-25).**
- 18. Jesus appears to about 500 disciples in Galilee (1 Corinthians 15:6).**
- 19. Jesus appears to His half-brother James (1 Corinthians 15:7).**
- 20. Jesus commissions His disciples (Matthew 28:16-20).**
- 21. Peter and John run to the tomb, see that it is empty, and find the grave clothes (Luke 24:12; John 20:2-10).**
- 22. Jesus teaches His disciples the Scriptures and promises to send the Holy Spirit (Luke 24:44-49; Acts 1:4-5).**
- 23. Jesus ascends into heaven (Luke 24:50-53; Acts 1:6-12).**

- So there was a conversation/discussion about the events that had taken place.
- Probably speculation as to what had happened to the body.
- May have been an argument – vs. 17

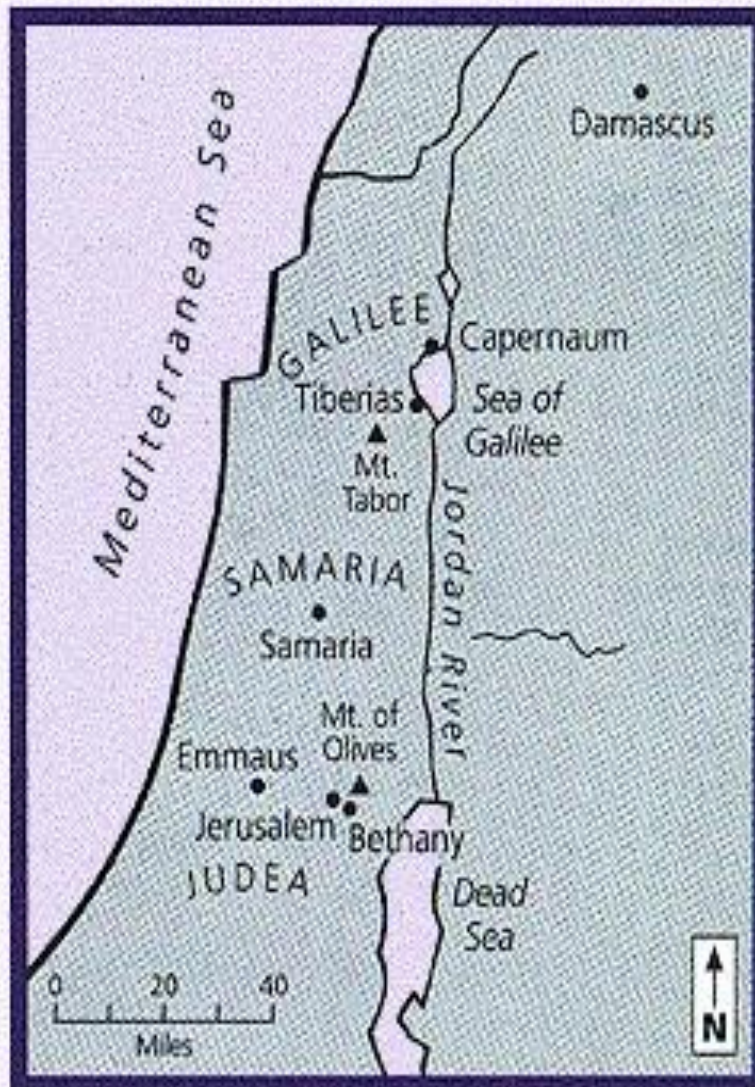
- Jesus comes out of nowhere and appears to them.

At the tomb. On early Sunday morning, Jesus appeared to Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome (Matt. 28:1-10; Mark 16:1-11; Luke 24:1-12; John 20:1-18).

At Jerusalem. Jesus appeared to Peter on Sunday (Luke 24:34; 1 Cor. 15:5).

The road to Emmaus. About midday Sunday, Jesus appeared to two travelers (Luke 24:13-32).

The Upper Room. Jesus appeared to ten disciples on Sunday evening (Mark 16:14; Luke 24:36-43; John 20:19-25), and again one week later, when Thomas was present (John 20:26-29; 1 Cor. 15:5).



The road to Damascus. Jesus confronted Saul of Tarsus in the middle of the day, an event that led to Saul's conversion (Acts 9:1-9; 1 Cor. 15:8).

Galilee. Jesus appeared to the eleven disciples in Galilee (Matt. 28:16-20; Mark 16:15-18). Later, He was seen by 500 followers, probably also in Galilee (1 Cor. 15:6).

The Sea of Galilee. Early one morning, Jesus appeared to seven of His disciples while they were fishing, and caused them to find a great catch of fish (John 21:1-23).

Location unknown. Jesus appeared to James the apostle (1 Cor. 15:7).

The Mount of Olives. Forty days after the Resurrection, Jesus met with the eleven disciples, leading women, His brothers, and others, whom He told to take His message throughout the world. He then ascended into heaven (Luke 24:46-53; Acts 1:3-14).

15 While they were talking and discussing, Jesus Himself approached and began traveling with them.

16 But their eyes were prevented from recognizing Him.

- Jesus comes out of nowhere and appears to them.
- Remember He has a resurrected body now – able to appear and disappear.
- Apparently, they are agreeable to let Him join them.
- But they don't recognize Him.
- God changes what Jesus looks like through their eyes.
- **Implication:**
 1. Jesus looked the same in His resurrected body as He did before the resurrection.
 2. Believers will be recognizable in heaven.
 3. We do not lose our physical, earthly identity. What changes is the substance of our physical body.

- Jesus begins with a question and follows-up with more questions. He wants to draw them out and show their ignorance of the Scriptures.

“exchanging” – ἀντιβαλλω – to cast back and forth, banter.

- They were not in agreement.
- So, they are faced with a dilemma – How are we going to decide this?
- At this point it is opinion vs. opinion.
- This mirrors what often goes on today in churches, Bible schools/colleges, seminaries – opinions, views, perspectives, theories, assumptions, speculations, estimations, etc.
- No clarity, no solutions, no answers, only conjecture.
- So, they stop walking and are aghast at His question.
- But this has resulted in their sadness.

- "Where have you been? This is the talk of the city."
- They really have a condescending attitude.
- "We know what is going on." But their knowledge was limited, and in reality, their ignorance was great!

- Jesus forces them to testify to what exactly has happened.
- They get this right.

- Now it is Jesus's turn to speak and set the record straight.
- He describes them in 2 ways:
 1. **"foolish"** – *ανοητος* – to not think, unintelligent, to not exercise the mind.
 2. **"slow of heart"** – sluggish, dull, slack in believing.
- Why? Because they failed to study and apply the Word.
- What would they learn from the Scriptures?

That it was necessary for Christ to die and rise from the dead into glory.
- Jesus drives them back to the Word. They are going, in the future, to need to rely on the Word.

Luke 24:13-27

- 13 And behold, two of them were going that very day to a village named Emmaus, which was about seven miles from Jerusalem.
- 14 And they were talking with each other about all these things which had taken place.
- 15 While they were talking and discussing, Jesus Himself approached and began traveling with them.
- 16 But their eyes were prevented from recognizing Him.
- 17 And He said to them, "What are these words that you are exchanging with one another as you are walking?" And they stood still, looking sad.
- 18 One of them, named Cleopas, answered and said to Him, "Are You the only one visiting Jerusalem and unaware of the things which have happened here in these days?"
- 19 And He said to them, "What things?" And they said to Him, "The things about Jesus the Nazarene, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word in the sight of God and all the people,

- Jesus begins with the first 5 books of the O.T. and goes all the way through the prophets.
- What does He explain? How He is found in all of the O.T. scriptures.
- It is all there. It is clear. You can understand it. You have no excuse.
- Instead of sadness, they should be rejoicing.

Application

1. Believers can go off the rails in what they believe, if they are not tethered tightly to the Scriptures.
