Luke 24:13-27

13 And behold, two of them were going that very day to a village named Emmaus, which was about seven miles from Jerusalem.

14 And they were talking with each other about all these things which had taken place.

15 While they were talking and discussing, Jesus Himself approached and began traveling with them.

16 But their eyes were prevented from recognizing Him.

17 And He said to them, "What are these words that you are exchanging with one another as you are walking?" And they stood still, looking sad.

18 One of them, named Cleopas, answered and said to Him, "Are You the only one visiting Jerusalem and unaware of the things which have happened here in these days?"

19 And He said to them, "What things?" And they said to Him, "The things about Jesus the Nazarene, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word in the sight of God and all the people,

20 and how the chief priests and our rulers delivered Him to the sentence of death, and crucified Him.

21 "But we were hoping that it was He who was going to redeem Israel. Indeed, besides all this, it is the third day since these things happened.

22 "But also some women among us amazed us. When they were at the tomb early in the morning,

23 and did not find His body, they came, saying that they had also seen a vision of angels who said that He was alive.

24 "Some of those who were with us went to the tomb and found it just exactly as the women also had said; but Him they did not see."

25 And He said to them, "O foolish men and slow of heart to believe in all that the prophets have spoken!

26 "Was it not necessary for the Christ to suffer these things and to enter into His glory?"

27 Then beginning with Moses and with all the prophets, He explained to them the things concerning Himself in all the Scriptures.

Luke 24:28-35

28 And they approached the village where they were going, and He acted as though He were going farther.

29 But they urged Him, saying, "Stay with us, for it is getting toward evening, and the day is now nearly over." So He went in to stay with them.

30 When He had reclined at the table with them, He took the bread and blessed it, and breaking it, He began giving it to them.

31 Then their eyes were opened and they recognized Him; and He vanished from their sight.

32 They said to one another, "Were not our hearts burning within us while He was speaking to us on the road, while He was explaining the Scriptures to us?"

33 And they got up that very hour and returned to Jerusalem, and found gathered together the eleven and those who were with them,

34 saying, "The Lord has really risen and has appeared to Simon."

35 They began to relate their experiences on the road and how He was recognized by them in the breaking of the bread.

28 And they approached the village where they were going, and He acted as though He were going farther.

- “acted” – showed movement, actions that indicated. Jesus intended to keep going. Not pretended. Not faking it. Jesus was always upright and honest in His intentions.
- His mission was accomplished.
- Jesus appeared to these two to teach them and help them understand why His mission had not failed.
- He takes them right through the Scripture of the O.T.
- How ridiculous for someone today, like Andy Stanley, to say we need to unhitch the O.T. Scriptures from the rest of the Bible.

‘Hey, it’s time that we face the facts and unhitch our faith and our practice from some of these Old Testament values that we can appreciate in their original context, but we really don’t have any business dragging them into a modern context.’

“ . . . the less we depend on the Old Testament to prop up our New Testament faith the better because of where we are in [the] culture.”

“I’m convinced that we make a better case for Jesus if we leave the Old Testament or the old covenant out of the argument.”

- This is as old as the Marcion heresy of the 2nd century.

29 But they urged Him, saying, "Stay with us, for it is getting toward evening, and the day is now nearly over." So He went in to stay with them.

“urged” – παραβιάζομαι – to compel, to constrain, to beg. Strong word.

- They had an incredible hunger for the Scripture to be taught to them. They really could not get enough!
- That is what the Word does for us. It calms our fears. It lifts us up. It gives us understanding.
- When you have been blessed by the Word, you want more. Like Lay’s potato chips – “bet you can’t have just one.”

Ps 34:8

8 O taste and see that the Lord is good;

- They could not stop, they wanted more.
- Jesus was more than willing to give them more. He is the same with us.

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- This is the supper meal. Not communion – no wine.
- Bread was a usual place to start. Used for dipping.
- **Note:** He prayed before the meal.
- Jesus is acting like the host. Why? He's hungry and they are running on adrenaline.
- It's been a long day, a long walk . . . time to eat.
- But the 2 followers of Jesus want only to be fed the bread of the Word.

Matt 4:4

4 "It is written, 'MAN SHALL NOT LIVE ON BREAD ALONE, BUT ON EVERY WORD THAT PROCEEDS OUT OF THE MOUTH OF GOD.'"

31 Then their eyes were opened and they recognized Him; and He vanished from their sight.

- At this point, God opens their eyes.

God opens the eyes, just like at salvation:

1. "Dead" Eph. 2:1-4
2. "Blind" 2 Cor. 4:3-6
3. "Unregenerate" Jn. 3:1-8; 1 Pet. 1:3
4. "Slaves of sin" Rom. 6:17,18

- **"vanished"** – disappear.
- **Note:** Did Jesus leave them? No. They could not see Him any longer but He was still there with them. (Heb. 13:5)
- So it is with us. We can't see Him, but He is always with us.

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- God was doing a work in their hearts with His Word.
- Here is how they felt – "It was like a fire within them."

Jer 23:29

29 "Is not My Word like fire?" declares the Lord,

- If you hunger for the Word and to be taught, God will meet your need.

Matt 5:6

6 "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied.

- CCC

33 And they got up that very hour and returned to Jerusalem, and found gathered together the eleven and those who were with them,

- Wow! Are they excited or what?
- It may be 8 or 9 in the evening. They have a 2 ½ hour walk back to Jerusalem. It doesn't matter. This is life-changing news that needs to be shared.
- Dark, dangerous.
- The 11 are there + others.
- They can't wait to tell them.

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"One of the marks of true conversion is the way a person's heart is changed by the indwelling Christ. Truth and events that once seemed unimportant or even irrelevant take on new significance, new meaning. A cold, dead heart that was completely wrapped up in self-centered pursuits begins to thaw and warm to the realities of the Spirit and the needs of others. John Wesley described it by saying his heart was "strangely warmed"; the Emmaus-bound disciples asked, "Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on the road, while he was opening the scriptures to us?" Does your heart burn for the realities of God? Has it grown cold due to neglect or sin? Only by spending time in the presence of the living Christ can you reverse the cooling process. Make a commitment to spend some time with him—today."

- The 11 had already heard from Peter.
- They were ready for more good news.
- God is confirming over and over the truth of the resurrection – women, Peter, and now Cleopas and traveling companion.

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- Now it is their turn to share their story.
- What did they share?
 - a man joins them on their way walking to Emmaus.
 - they spend 2 hours+ in in-depth Bible study.
 - they see Jesus all over the O.T. Scriptures.
 - their hearts burned with excitement.
 - they arrive at Emmaus and beg the man to stay and teach them more.
 - He does but must eat.
 - after a prayer and bread, they recognize that the man is Jesus.
 - He disappears in thin air.
 - So we make fast tracks back here to share this with you.

Application

1. Those who “hunger and thirst for righteousness” will demonstrate their hunger by their passion for God’s Word. It will be seen in individuals, Christian organizations, Christian colleges, seminaries and churches.
2. The level of your “divine heartburn” will be in proportion to your craving for the Word.
3. When you study the Word or hear the Word taught, expect it to have an affect on you.
4. Don’t forget to share your excitement.
