Hab 1:1-4

1 The oracle which Habakkuk the prophet saw.

2 **How long**, O Lord, will I call for help,

And You will not hear?

I **cry out** to You, "Violence!"

Yet You do not save.

3 Why do You make me see iniquity,

And cause me to look on **wickedness**?

Yes, **destruction** and violence are before me;

Strife exists and **contention** arises.

4 Therefore **the law is ignored**

And justice is never upheld.

For the **wicked surround the righteous**;

Therefore **justice comes out perverted.**

5 "Look among the nations! Observe! Be astonished! Wonder! Because I am doing something in your days — You would not believe if you were told.

- This is God's answer to Habakkuk's prayer.
- It is not what Hab. wanted to hear.
- "Look, observe, be astonished, wonder!"
- The answer does not come in the form of revival for Judah, but judgment on Judah.
- God will use the ungodly, pagan, idolatrous nation of Babylon (Chaldeans) to bring judgment on Judah.
- Hab. is to look at the nations. Babylon is on a tear. They have gone up and conquered Assyria and now will be moving down to capture Judah.

“God had warned His people time and time again, but they wouldn’t listen. Prophet after prophet had declared the Word (2Chr 36:14–21), only to be rejected, and He had sent natural calamities like droughts and plagues, and various military defeats, but the people wouldn’t listen. Instead of repenting, the people hardened their hearts even more and turned for help to the gods of the nations around them. They had tried God’s long-suffering long enough and it was time for God to act”

5 "Look among the nations! Observe! Be astonished! Wonder! Because I am doing something in your days — You would not believe if you were told.

- God may be silent to Habakkuk but He is actively working.
- Because we get so focused, so narrow, so locked in to how we think God should answer our prayers, we can't accept or believe God's answer if we were told it.
- **Note:** God is sovereign over the nations and the leaders of those nations – Kings, Prime Ministers, Emperors, Monarchs, Chancellors, Sultans, Supreme Leaders, Premiers, Presidents.

Dan 2:21

21 "It is He who changes the times and the epochs;

He removes kings and establishes kings;

1 The **king's heart** is like channels of water in the hand of the Lord; He turns it wherever He wishes.

- **“behold”** - **הִנֵּה** **hen** (**hane**) - expresses surprise
“Pay attention to this. It will surprise you.”
- **“I am raising up . . .”** – this is a God thing.
- **Chaldeans** – another name for the Babylonians. They were the intellectual group of the Babylonians. Known for their study of astrology and astronomy. The “Wise men” came from this group. Abraham came from the Chaldeans (Gen. 15:7)
- **“What?”** “What do they have to do with the answer to my prayer?”
- God says, “Let me tell you about them.” 21 characteristics –
 1. **Fierce** – discontent, angry.
 2. **Impetuous** – acts quickly without thought. Impulsive.
 3. **March throughout the earth** – they are out to conquer the world.
 4. **Seize** - Capture and conquer land, possessions, homes, buildings.

5. **Dreaded** – to frighten, to make afraid.

6. **Feared** – terrible, dangerous.

7. **Justice and authority** – they determine what is right and wrong. They are the standard. They can do whatever they want. Lawless. They do not submit to anyone or anything. They are a law unto themselves.

Judges 21:25

25 In those days there was no king in Israel; **everyone did what was right in his own eyes.**

• **Note:** God uses 3 different animals to describe the Chaldeans.

8. **Swift** – like **leopards** – 35-36 mph.

9. **Keen** – eager, intense, sharp. Like a **wolf** looking for his evening meal. The Chaldeans will not be kind or gentle.

Acts 20:29

29 "I know that after my departure **savage wolves** will come in among you, not sparing the flock;

Matt 7:15

15 "Beware of the false prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly are **ravenous wolves**.

10. **Gallop** – to move at a fast pace, sprinting. They move quickly to their goal.

11. **Come from afar** – distance is not an obstacle. What they desire to conquer, is not impeded by the amount of separation between 2 points.

12. **Swoop down** – like an **eagle** going 100 mph to eat.

13. **Violence** – to do damage, to do wrong for unjust gain. Judah's violence will be repaid with Chaldean violence.
14. **Horde of faces** – accumulation of faces coming at you, pressing forward with determination.
15. **Collect captives** – capturing their victims is as easy as scooping up sand on a beach or desert.

16. **Mock kings** – scorn, ridicule, mimic, scoff at.

17. **Laugh at rulers** – to make fun of. Think they are a joke. No fear.

18. **Laugh at every fortress** – total confidence they can defeat and destroy any obstacle.

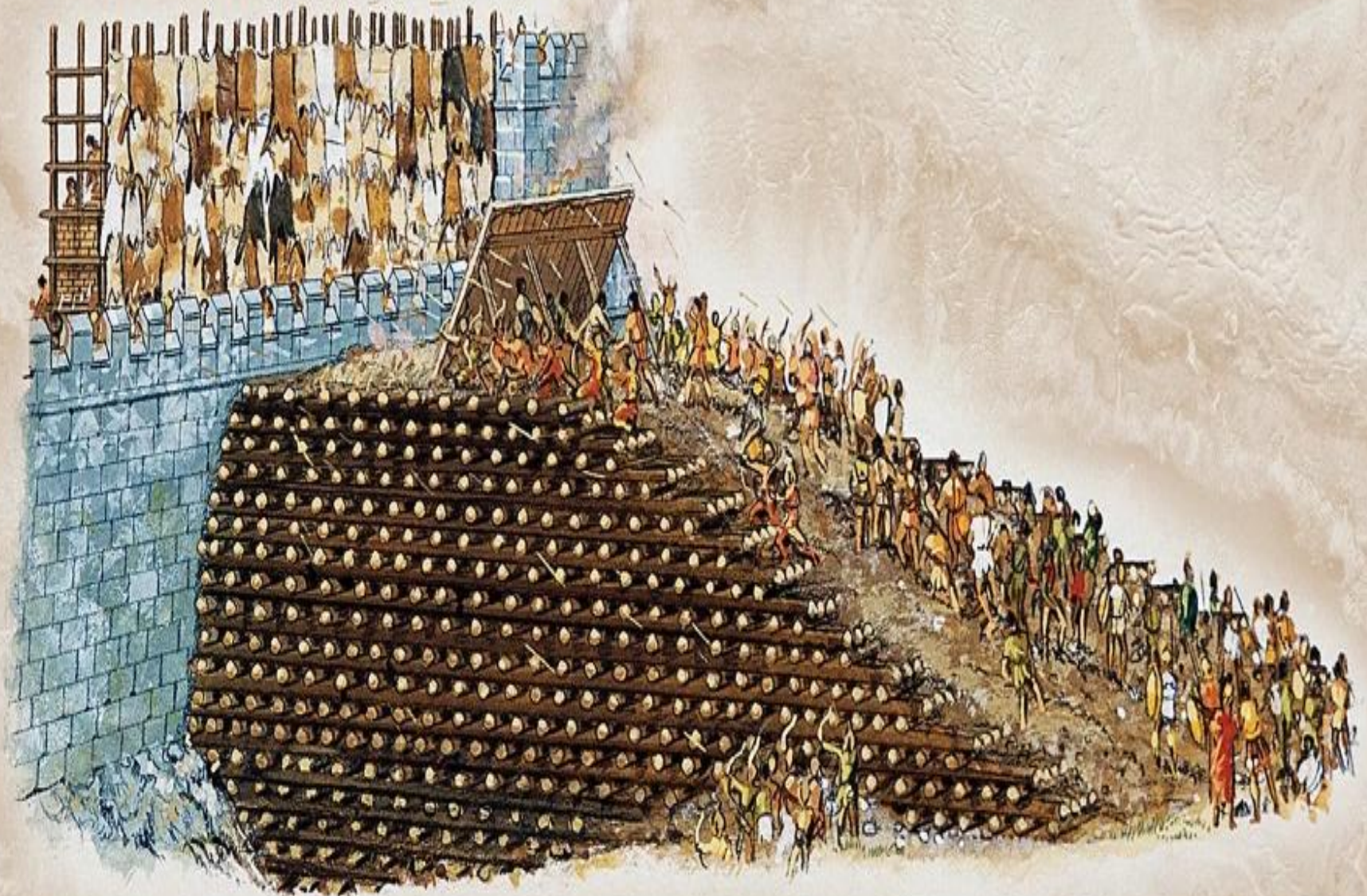
19. **Heap up rubble** – a designed plan to capture a fortress.

20. **Sweep through** – like the movement of wind which comes quickly and goes quickly.

21. **Idolatry** – They believe their strength comes from their god. The Chaldeans will be judged by God for their wickedness and idolatry.
God is not on their side.

1 Sam 16:14

14 Now the Spirit of the Lord departed from Saul, and an evil spirit from the Lord terrorized him.

1 Kings 22:23

23 "Now therefore, behold, the Lord has put a deceiving spirit in the mouth of all these your prophets; and the Lord has proclaimed disaster against you."

Application
