9 "Woe to him who gets evil gain for his house

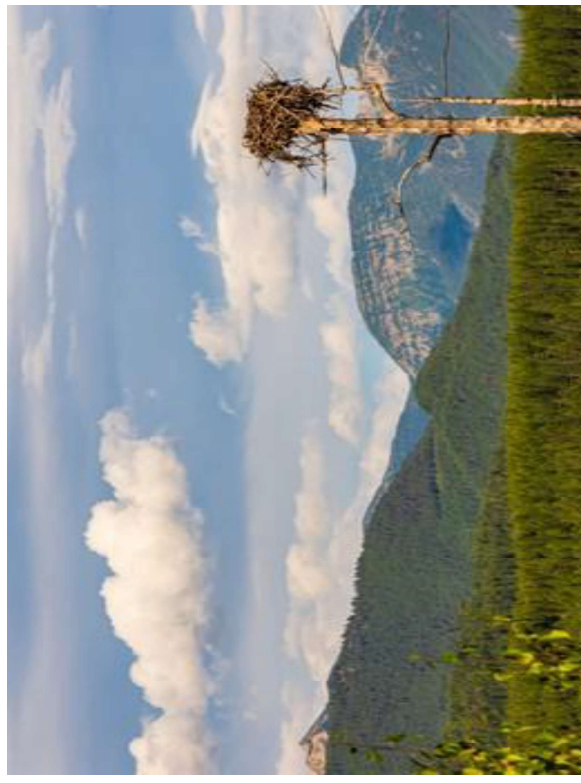
9 "Woe to him who gets evil gain for his house

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- Here is the 2nd "Woe" (pronouncement of judgment).
- This is extortion – obtaining something of value, by force. Unjust enrichment.
- He is doing it to gain advantage for his house.
- What advantage does he want?
- Safety and security.
- **Like an eagle, he wants 2 things:**

1. Security – no one can touch him.
2. Safety – no harm can befall him.

Prov 18:11-12

11 A rich man's wealth is his strong city,
And like a high wall in his own imagination.
12 Before destruction the heart of man is haughty,
But humility goes before honor.

Jer 22:13-14

13 "Woe to him who builds his house without righteousness
And his upper rooms without justice,
Who uses his neighbor's services without pay
And does not give him his wages,
14 Who says, 'I will build myself a roomy house
With spacious upper rooms,
And cut out its windows,
And panel it with cedar and painting it bright red.'

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- "devised" - יָצַר *ya`ats* (yaw-ats) - to deliberate, to determine, to purpose, to devise.
- "You have devised" - this is your decision.
- **Note:** Even though God is sovereignly in control (vs 13) of what is going to happen, the Chaldeans are still held responsible for their decisions and actions.
- "cutting off" - חָצַק *qatsah* (kaw-isaw) - to destroy.
- They are "sinning against themselves" – they are bringing damnation upon themselves. They are "slitting their own throats."
- They are self-deceived. They are only increasing the wrath that will fall on them.

Rom 2:5

5 But because of your stubbornness and unrepentant heart you are storing up wrath for yourself in the day of wrath and revelation of the righteous judgment of God.

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**11 "Surely the stone will cry out from the wall,
And the rafter will answer it from the framework.**

- Stones and wood were used to make the Chaldean's palaces, fortresses, and idols.
 - They are testimonies to the unjust, corrupt way the Chaldeans obtained the materials.
- Gen 4:10**
10 He said, "What have you done? The voice of your brother's blood is crying to Me from the ground."

**12 "Woe to him who builds a city with bloodshed
And founds a town with violence!**

- Here is the 3rd "Woe".
- Judgment will come to the Chaldeans for their murder and violence against those they conquered.
- No nation will ever get away with building a society on pride, greed, extortion, and violence.
- Violence begins with hatred and intolerance, and escalates from there.

"The stones and woodwork taken from other nations to build the Babylonians' fortresses and palaces would serve as visual witnesses to the sinful invasions that brought them to Babylon. They would testify to the guilt of the Babylonians in the day that Yahweh would bring Babylon to judgment. Ostentatious buildings and cities make statements about their builders."

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"The Babylonians could expect distress because they had built their cities at the expense of the lives of their enemies. We speak of "blood money" as money obtained by making others suffer, even shedding their blood. Babylon was built with "blood money" and the blood, sweat, and tears of enslaved people. It was a town founded on injustice; without injustice it could not have become what it had become."

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Jer 51:58

8 Thus says the Lord of hosts,

"The broad wall of Babylon will be completely razed
And her high gates will be set on fire;

So the peoples will toil for nothing,

And the nations become exhausted only for fire."

13 "Is it not indeed from the Lord of hosts

That peoples toil for fire,

And nations grow weary for nothing?

- What seems to be out of control, is totally in the control of a sovereign God.
- God's sovereignty is so deep that He uses an evil, wicked nation to achieve His purposes.
- There is nothing too evil that God cannot use it, including Satan himself.
- All that the Chaldeans will accomplish will "go up in smoke."
- When the Medes and the Persians conquered Babylon 47 years later, Babylon burned to the ground.

"weary for nothing - How foolish to put your time and resources into that which is going to burn-up in the end.

2 Peter 3:10-13

10 But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, in which the heavens will pass away with a roar and the elements will be destroyed with intense heat, and the earth and its works will be burned up.

11 Since all these things are to be destroyed in this way, what sort of people ought you to be in holy conduct and godliness,

12 looking for and hastening the coming of the day of God, because of which the heavens will be destroyed by burning, and the elements will melt with intense heat!

13 But according to His promise we are looking for new heavens and a new earth, in which righteousness dwells.

"glory" - קְבוֹד (kav-bode') - weighty, heavy, wealth.

• The sea has depth and breadth.

• God will be known much deeper and much broader than He is known now and that knowledge will be eternal. Sin clouds our present understanding.

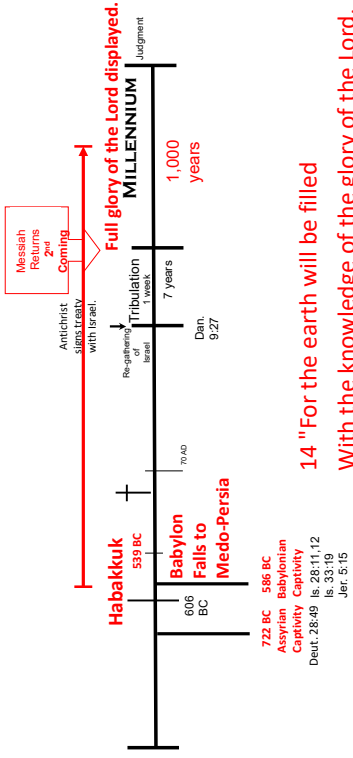
• **"knowledge" - יָדָע (yav-dah')** - to know intimately, to be in relationship with. It is more than just information.
