

## "DEALING TREACHEROUSLY"

Malachi 2:10-16

March 11, 2012

- 10 "Do we not all have one father? Has not one God created us? Why do we deal treacherously each against his brother so as to profane the covenant of our fathers?
- 11 "Judah has dealt treacherously, and an abomination has been committed in Israel and in Jerusalem; for Judah has profaned the sanctuary of the Lord which He loves and has married the daughter of a foreign god.
- 12 "As for the man who does this, may the Lord cut off from the tents of Jacob everyone who awakes and answers, or who presents an offering to the Lord of hosts.
- 13 "This is another thing you do: you cover the altar of the Lord with tears, with weeping and with groaning, because He no longer regards the offering or accepts it with favor from your hand.
- 14 "Yet you say, 'For what reason?' Because the Lord has been a witness between you and the wife of your youth, against whom you have dealt treacherously, though she is your companion and your wife by covenant.
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## John 8:44

44 "You are of your father the devil, and you want to do the desires of your father.

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## **Deut 7:1-5**

- 1 "When the Lord your God brings you into the land where you are entering to possess it, and clears away many nations before you, the Hittites and the Girgashites and the Amorites and the Canaanites and the Perizzites and the Hivites and the Jebusites, seven nations greater and stronger than you,
- 2 and when the Lord your God delivers them before you and you defeat them, then you shall utterly destroy them. You shall make no covenant with them and show no favor to them.
- 3 "Furthermore, you shall not intermarry with them; you shall not give your daughters to their sons, nor shall you take their daughters for your sons.
- 4 "For they will turn your sons away from following Me to serve other gods; then the anger of the Lord will be kindled against you and He will quickly destroy you.

### 2 Cor 6:14-18

- 14 Do not be bound together with unbelievers; for what partnership have righteousness and lawlessness, or what fellowship has light with darkness?
- 15 Or what harmony has Christ with Belial, or what has a believer in common with an unbeliever?
- 16 Or what agreement has the temple of God with idols? For we are the temple of the living God; just as God said,
  - "I WILL DWELL IN THEM AND WALK AMONG THEM;
  - AND I WILL BE THEIR GOD, AND THEY SHALL BE MY PEOPLE.
- 17 "Therefore, COME OUT FROM THEIR MIDST AND BE SEPARATE," says the Lord.
- "AND DO NOT TOUCH WHAT IS UNCLEAN;
- And I will welcome you.
- 18 "And I will be a father to you,
- And you shall be sons and daughters to Me,"
- Says the Lord Almighty.

#### Ezra 9:1-10:3

- Now when these things had been completed, the princes approached me, saying, "The people of Israel and the priests and the Levites have not separated themselves from the peoples of the lands, according to their abominations, those of the Canaanites, the Hittites, the Perizzites, the Jebusites, the Ammonites, the Moabites, the Egyptians and the Amorites.
- "For they have taken some of their daughters as wives for themselves and for their sons, so that the holy race has intermingled with the peoples of the lands; indeed, the hands of the princes and the rulers have been foremost in this unfaithfulness."
- When I heard about this matter, I tore my garment and my robe, and pulled some of the hair from my head and my beard, and sat down appalled.
- Then everyone who trembled at the words of the God of Israel on account of the unfaithfulness of the exiles gathered to me, and I sat appalled until the evening offering.
- But at the evening offering I arose from my humiliation, even with my garment and my robe torn, and I fell on my knees and stretched out my hands to the Lord my God;
- and I said, "O my God, I am ashamed and embarrassed to lift up my face to You, my God, for our iniquities have risen above our heads and our guilt has grown even to the heavens.
- "Since the days of our fathers to this day we have been in great guilt, and on account of our iniquities we, our kings and our priests have been given into the hand of the kings of the lands, to the sword, to captivity and to plunder and to open shame, as it is this day.

- 8 "But now for a brief moment grace has been shown from the Lord our God, to leave us an escaped remnant and to give us a peg in His holy place, that our God may enlighten our eyes and grant us a little reviving in our bondage.
- 9 "For we are slaves; yet in our bondage our God has not forsaken us, but has extended lovingkindness to us in the sight of the kings of Persia, to give us reviving to raise up the house of our God, to restore its ruins and to give us a wall in Judah and Jerusalem.
- 10 "Now, our God, what shall we say after this? For we have forsaken Your commandments,
- 11 which You have commanded by Your servants the prophets, saying, 'The land which you are entering to possess is an unclean land with the uncleanness of the peoples of the lands, with their abominations which have filled it from end to end and with their impurity.
- 12 'So now do not give your daughters to their sons nor take their daughters to your sons, and never seek their peace or their prosperity, that you may be strong and eat the good things of the land and leave it as an inheritance to your sons forever.'
- 13 "After all that has come upon us for our evil deeds and our great guilt, since You our God have requited us less than our iniquities deserve, and have given us an escaped remnant as this,
- 14 shall we again break Your commandments and intermarry with the peoples who commit these abominations? Would You not be angry with us to the point of destruction, until there is no remnant nor any who escape?
- 15 "O Lord God of Israel, You are righteous, for we have been left an escaped remnant, as it is this day; behold, we are before You in our guilt, for no one can stand before You because of this."

# Ezra 10:1,2

- 1 Now while Ezra was praying and making confession, weeping and prostrating himself
  - before the house of God, a very large assembly, men, women and children, gathered
  - to him from Israel; for the people wept bitterly.
- 2 Shecaniah the son of Jehiel, one of the sons of Elam, said to Ezra, "We have been
  - unfaithful to our God and have married foreign women from the peoples of the land;

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## Matt 19:3-7

- 3 Some Pharisees came to Jesus, testing Him and asking, "Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife for any reason at all?"
- 4 And He answered and said, "Have you not read that He who created them from the beginning MADE THEM MALE AND FEMALE,
- 5 and said, 'FOR THIS REASON A MAN SHALL LEAVE HIS FATHER AND MOTHER AND BE JOINED TO HIS WIFE, AND THE TWO SHALL BECOME ONE FLESH'?
- 6 "So they are no longer two, but one flesh. What therefore God has joined together, let no man separate."

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#### Gen 15:2-4

- 2 Abram said, "O Lord God, what will You give me, since I am childless, and the heir of my house is Eliezer of Damascus?"
- 3 And Abram said, "Since You have given no offspring to me, one born in my house is my heir."
- 4 Then behold, the word of the Lord came to him, saying, "This man will not be your heir;

#### Gen 16:1-6

- 16 Now Sarai, Abram's wife had borne him no children, and she had an Egyptian maid whose name was Hagar.
- 2 So Sarai said to Abram, "Now behold, the Lord has prevented me from bearing children. Please go in to my maid; perhaps I will obtain children through her." And Abram listened to the voice of Sarai.
- 3 After Abram had lived ten years in the land of Canaan, Abram's wife Sarai took Hagar the Egyptian, her maid, and gave her to her husband Abram as his wife.
- 4 He went in to Hagar, and she conceived; and when she saw that she had conceived, her mistress was despised in her sight.
- 5 And Sarai said to Abram, "May the wrong done me be upon you. I gave my maid into your arms, but when she saw that she had conceived, I was despised in her sight. May the Lord judge between you and me."
- 6 But Abram said to Sarai, "Behold, your maid is in your power; do to her what is good in your sight." So Sarai treated her harshly, and she fled from her presence.

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# **Application**

- 1. Believers are forbidden in the Bible from marrying unbelievers. Why?
  - A. The marriage partners will be "pulling" in different directions.
  - B. The believer will conform to the unbeliever and not the reverse. The spiritual can become carnal but the unspiritual can not become spiritual (without the new birth).
  - C. There are no guarantees that the unbeliever will ever be saved.

### 1 Cor 7:16

16 For how do you know, O wife, whether you will save your husband? Or how do you know, O husband, whether you will save your wife?

- 2. Therefore it is best for a believer not even to date an unbeliever. Emotions, infatuation, are very powerful and can cloud a believer's understanding of what is at stake. Dating evangelism has no biblical support.
- 3. Divorcing your spouse to marry an unbeliever is wrong on 3 accounts:
  - A. Divorce is wrong.B. Marrying and unbeliever is wrong.
  - C. Being unfaithful to God and His Word are wrong.
- 4. If you go into a sin knowing it is wrong but think you can superficially ask for forgiveness after you sin think again God will reject your request.
- 5. Marriage in God's eyes is a lifelong covenant made between 1 man and 1 woman.
