1 The oracle of Nineveh. The book of the vision of Nahum the Elkoshite.


Nahum

Author: Holy Spirit/Nahum from Elkosh (1:1)

Date: Between 663 b.c (fall of Thebes, 3:8-10) and 612 b.c. (the fall of Nineveh, (2:1; 3:14,19).

Approx. 100 - 150 years after Book of Jonah.

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Approx. 100 - 150 years after Book of Jonah.

Place: Jerusalem

Readers: Judah

Purpose: A Prophecy of God's judgment and destruction of the city of Nineveh and the kingdom of Assyria.

Literary style and uniqueness of Nahum:

"Though the rhythm and metre of Nahum are not so smooth and regular as is the case with some Heb. prophets, yet in some respects the poetry of Nahum is unsurpassed in the OT. His excellence is not in sublimity of thought, depth of feeling, purity of motive, or insight into truth and life. It is rather in his descriptive powers. He has an unexcelled capacity to bring a situation vividly before the mind's eye."

Nahum uses metaphor, simile, synecdoche (a part is made to represent the whole), woe (great sorrow or distress), satire, dirge (a mournful song), various parallel structures, partial acrostic, alliteration (the occurrence of the same letter or sound at the beginning of adjacent or closely connected words), assonance (repetition of the sound of a vowel to produce an echo effect), and prose.

"This prophecy of Nahum reveals something of God more clearly than any other book of the Bible. It is the job of the prophet to reveal to us the character of God. The prophets unfold for us the divine attributes and each sees God in a different light. As you read through the prophets, therefore, you are seeing one facet after another, flashing like a diamond in the sunlight, of the mighty character and attributes of an eternal God."






- History or Narrative: These are stories and epics and include Genesis, Exodus, Numbers, Joshua, Judges, Ruth, 1 and 2 Samuel, 1 and 2 Kings, 1 and 2 Chronicles, Ezra, Nehemiah, Esther, Jonah, Matthew, Mark, Luke, John, and Acts.
- Law: These are the instructions and precepts of God given to us through Moses, such as Leviticus and Deuteronomy.
- Wisdom: These are the literature of maxims (general truths of how to conduct oneself) and sayings such as Job, Proverbs, and Ecclesiastes.
- **Poetry:** These are the prose and rhymes such as Psalms, Song of Solomon, and Lamentations.


- Prophecy: These include both major and minor prophets such as Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, Daniel, Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Micah, Nahum, Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah, and Malachi.
- Apocalyptic: These are combinations of narrative and prose written in vivid imagery and poetic phrases such as Daniel and most of Revelation.
- **Parable:** These are the sayings of Jesus that are narrative and instructional, contained in the Gospels.
- **Epistle/Didactic:** These are the letters written to a specific audience that are doctrinal such as Romans, Corinthians, Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, Thessalonians, Timothy, Titus, Philemon, Hebrews, James, Peter, John, and the first three chapters of Revelation.

Nahum 1:1-3

Sept. 7, 2014

- 1 The oracle of Nineveh. The book of the vision of Nahum the Elkoshite.
- 2 A jealous and avenging God is the Lord;
- The Lord is avenging and wrathful.
- The Lord takes vengeance on His adversaries,
- And He reserves wrath for His enemies.
- 3 The Lord is slow to anger and great in power,
- And the Lord will by no means leave the guilty
- unpunished.
- In whirlwind and storm is His way,
- And clouds are the dust beneath His feet.

What is God Like?

ASEITY - He is self-existent.

IMMUTABILITY - He is not subject to change in His person.

- **INFINITY -** He is free from all limitations other than self-limitation.
 - ***Perfect** in Being (complete, finished, lacking in nothing; no defect).
 - *Eternal in time.
 - *Omnipresent everywhere in space.

SPIRITUALITY - He is spirit.

- *Life He is the source of all personal energy.
- ***Personality** He is the source of personal spontaneity of will.
- **MENTALITY** He is the ultimate in intellect.
 - *Omniscience all knowing.
 - *Wisdom all-wise.
 - *Veracity all-truth.
 - *Faithful all-trustworthy.

MORALITY - He is the ultimate in purity.

*Goodness - He is the source of all that is good in the universe.

Love Grace Mercy Patience

*Holiness - His character is free from all impurity.

*Righteousness - His conduct is free from all impurity.

*Justice - His judgment is free from all impurity and able to determine reward or punishment based on His holiness and righteousness contained in the Law.

Anger Wrath

Vengeance Judgment

SOVEREIGNTY - He is the highest ruler in the universe and is the source, the means, and the goal (Rom. 11:36) of all events, actions, decisions, and all else that affects man in his existence.

*Will - He prosecutes His plan designed from eternity past, throughout all of time and eternity future.

*Omnipotent - He is all-powerful.

Everything in your Christian life is built on who you believe God is.

For instance:

What do I know about God when I go through trials?

He will be with me(omnipresent) in my trial.

He is more powerful (omnipotent) than my trial.

He knows (omniscient) what I am going through.

He will be faithful to see me through the trial.

The trial is part of His wise (wisdom) plan for my life.

He will be patient, loving, gracious, and merciful with me as I go through the trial.

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The Jealousy of God

Ex 34:14

14 for you shall not worship any other god, for the Lord, whose name is Jealous, is a jealous God

Deut 4:24

24 "For the Lord your God is a consuming fire, a jealous God.

Gal 5:19-21

- 19 Now the deeds of the flesh are evident, which are: immorality, impurity, sensuality,
- 20 idolatry, sorcery, enmities, strife, jealousy, outbursts of anger, disputes, dissensions, factions,
- 21 envying, drunkenness, carousing, and things like these,

2 Cor 11:2

2 For I am jealous for you with a godly jealousy;

Jealousy is a sin when it is a desire for something that does not belong to you.

Godly jealousy is when worship, praise, honor, or adoration is given to someone else other than God. God is jealous when someone gives to another something that rightly belongs to Him.

For what is He jealous -

1. Jealous for His name.

Ezek 39:25

25 Therefore thus says the Lord God, "Now I will restore the fortunes of Jacob and have mercy on the whole house of Israel; and I will be jealous for My holy name.

2. Jealous for Israel.

Zech 8:1-2

2 "Thus says the Lord of hosts, 'I am exceedingly jealous for Zion, yes, with great wrath I am jealous for her.'

Zech 1:14-15

'Thus says the Lord of hosts, "I am exceedingly jealous for Jerusalem and Zion.

3. Jealous for the Church.

2 Cor 11:2

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Avenge – to punish someone who has harmed you or someone or something that you care about.

Vengeance – to repay, to punish, to seek revenge for an offence committed.

Rom 12:19

19 Never take your own revenge, beloved, but leave room for the wrath of God, for it is written, "VENGEANCE IS MINE, I WILL REPAY,

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The Wrath of God

1. Why is God angry?

Because man has sinned and gone his own independent way.

Rom 5:18

18 So then as through one transgression there resulted condemnation to all men, **Eph 2:3**

3 Among them we too all formerly lived in the lusts of our flesh, indulging the desires of the flesh and of the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, even as the rest.

Rom 1:18

18 For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men who suppress the truth in unrighteousness,

Rom 2:5-6

5 But because of your stubbornness and unrepentant heart you are storing up wrath for yourself in the day of wrath and revelation of the righteous judgment of God,

6 who WILL RENDER TO EACH PERSON ACCORDING TO HIS DEEDS:

Eph 5:6

6 Let no one deceive you with empty words, for because of these things the wrath of God comes upon the sons of disobedience.

Col 3:5-6

- 5 Therefore consider the members of your earthly body as dead to immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed, which amounts to idolatry.
- 6 For it is because of these things that the wrath of God will come upon the sons of disobedience,

Rev 6:15-17

- 15 Then the kings of the earth and the great men and the commanders and the rich and the strong and every slave and free man hid themselves in the caves and among the rocks of the mountains;
- 16 and they said to the mountains and to the rocks, "Fall on us and hide us from the presence of Him who sits on the throne, and from the wrath of the Lamb;
- 17 for the great day of their wrath has come, and who is able to stand?"

Rev 14:9-10

- 9 Then another angel, a third one, followed them, saying with a loud voice, "If anyone worships the beast and his image, and receives a mark on his forehead or on his hand,
- 10 he also will drink of the wine of the wrath of God, which is mixed in full strength in the cup of His anger;

Rev 14:19-20

- 19 So the angel swung his sickle to the earth and gathered the clusters from the vine of the earth, and threw them into the great wine press of the wrath of God.
- 20 And the wine press was trodden outside the city, and blood came out from the wine press, up to the horses' bridles, for a distance of two hundred miles.

Rev 15:7

7 Then one of the four living creatures gave to the seven angels seven golden bowls full of the wrath of God, who lives forever and ever.

Rev 16:19-21

- 19 Babylon the great was remembered before God, to give her the cup of the wine of His fierce wrath.
- 20 And every island fled away, and the mountains were not found.
- 21 And huge hailstones, about one hundred pounds each, came down from heaven upon men; and men blasphemed God because of the plague of the hail, because its plague was extremely severe.

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Ezek 26:10

10 "Because of the multitude of his horses, the dust raised by them will cover you; your walls will shake at the noise of cavalry and wagons and chariots when he enters your gates as men enter a city that is breached.
