place, formed a mob and set the city in an uproar; and attacking the house of

 6 When they did not find them, they began dragging Jason and some brethren before the city authorities, shouting, "These men who have upset the world have come
- 7 and Jason has welcomed them, and they all act contrary to the decrees of Caesar, saying that there is another king, Jesus."
- 8 They stirred up the crowd and the city authorities who heard these things.
 9 And when they had received a pledge from Jason and the others, they released
- them.


 10 The brethren immediately sent Paul and Silas away by night to Berea, and when
