#### Justification vs. Sanctification

Justification is a legal declaration. It is not a process. Sanctification is a process.

Biblical Christianity stands alone among all religions where justification comes before sanctification.

### Phil 3:7-9

- 7 But whatever things were gain to me, those things I have counted as loss for the sake of Christ.
- 8 More than that, I count all things to be loss in view of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and count them but rubbish so that I may gain Christ,
- 9 and may be found in Him, <u>not having a</u>
  <u>righteousness of my own derived from the Law, but</u>
  <u>that which is through faith in Christ, the</u>
  <u>righteousness which comes from God on the basis</u>
  of faith,

When the ground of justification moves from Christ outside of us to the work of Christ inside of us, then the gospel shifts:

- 1. From external to internal.
- 2. From objective to subjective.
- "You know you are saved if your life shows evidence of salvation."

Then the next logical question is, "How good must I be, and for how long before I know I am

saved?" Therefore Faith + Works = Salvation

- 3. From Christ's righteousness to my righteousness.
- 4. From assurance in what <u>Christ</u> has done to no assurance in what <u>I</u> have done.
- 5. From a legal transaction to a personal possession.
- 6. From instant declaration to process transformation.
- 7. From a Christ-centered gospel to a man centered gospel.

  It is a backward gospel.

#### Justification vs. Sanctification

Justification is a legal declaration. It is not a process.

Sanctification is a process.

- Biblical Christianity stands alone among all religions where justification comes before sanctification.
- The 2 (Justification and Sanctification) are not to be confused by mixing them in a gospel presentation.
- Abraham was justified 19 years before the event of his obedience to sacrifice his son.

#### Gal 3:1-3

- 1 You foolish Galatians, who has bewitched you, before whose eyes Jesus Christ was publicly portrayed as crucified?
- 2 This is the only thing I want to find out from you: did you receive the Spirit by the works of the Law, or by hearing with faith?
- 3 Are you so foolish? Having begun by the Spirit, are you now being perfected by the flesh?
